

# 10 College Councils Represent Students

Just as students elect residence area representatives to the Student Government Association, they elect academic area representatives to their respective College Councils.

Each college has such a council, with election for seats (generally preceded by self-nomination) held in the fall and spring.

The proposed Student Government constitution provides that the ten council presidents sit in the SGA president's cabinet. Council presidents are elected by the council membership.

The councils serve the varying needs of their constituents and help students become acquainted with each other and with opportunities and jobs available to them in their chosen fields.

The job often involves both academic and social functions. They sponsor mixers, hold picnics, award scholarships and sponsor lectures.

Each council usually sponsors a specific project annually. Last year, for example, the Liberal Arts Student Council created the Liberal Arts Lecture Series. Members of the Liberal Arts faculty spoke once a month in this series which was free and open to all.

Other council projects include the Physical Education Council's monthly sports clinic, the Education Council's "Big-Little Sister" program for orienting freshmen, the Agriculture Council's selection of a Poultry Queen and the Engineering-Architecture Council's maintenance of calculators for the use of engineering students.

In addition, many council publish newsletters to provide information to the students in their school about new activities and events. One group sponsors a faculty banquet so that the students and faculty can meet on other than a classroom basis.

Still other programs include student teacher convocations, open houses, science fairs and dedication programs.

## Choir Will Sing On NBC Radio

An original selection written by George E. Ceiga, University organist, and performed by the University Choir will be broadcast nationally by NBC radio today.

The number, titled "Credo," was first presented by the University Choir under the direction of Mrs. Willa Taylor at the 1958 Easter Service in Schwab.
