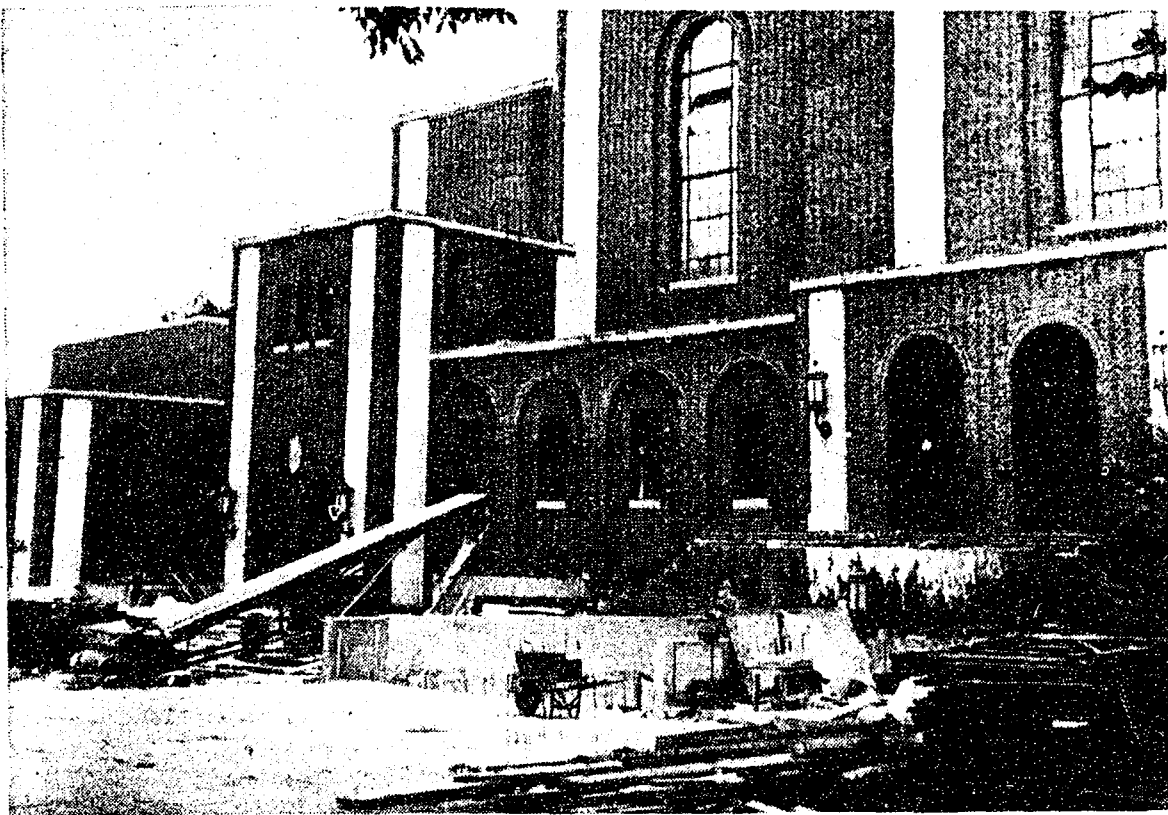


Recreation Hall Steps Razed, Renovated

"The women may possibly receive their training on weekends at Stone Valley as the first contingent did," Dr. George M. Guthrie, director of the second contingent training program said.

The men at the Puerto Rican camp have been sleeping and studying in Army surplus tents,

eating out of mess kits, and using makeshift shower rooms. As part of the program each man spent three days alone in the Rio Abajo wilderness with a minimum of survival equipment and his ingenuity. The purpose of the survival training is to develop physical fitness but also "to measure a man's stamina, courage and resourcefulness." Rev. William S. Coffin, director of the camp, said. He said "The assumption is that a man who can demonstrate these qualities here, is more likely to show them in another situation."
