

Thinclads Lack Depth

Cross-country championships aren't won with only three men, but if they were Penn State would be sitting pretty.

The harriers have three of the best distance runners in the East in Gerry Norman, Steve Moorhead and Howie Deardorff, and if Werner can come up with one more reliable runner the Lions could be a tough team to beat.

But that may take some doing. "We have a three man nucleus —Norman, Moorhead and Deardorff," Werner said yesterday, "and that is the end of the story."

Werner's search for a fourth runner centers around three men, Ernie Noll, Mike Miller and Lionel Bassett.

Noll, a senior from Quakertown, flashed signs of developing into a good runner last year. Bassett finished 26th in the IC4A's as a sophomore last year and if he continues to improve he could help.

Werner also rates Fred Larson and Dave LaHoff as possible contenders to help the Lions.

Werner's crew won the IC4A championship last year with almost the same team he has this year. Herm Weber and Denny Johnson are the only two members lost through graduation, but Weber was a valuable asset.

Along with Norman and Moorhead he made up State's "Big Three," which was virtually unbeatable in dual meets.

Only two runners, Michigan's Clay Ward and Pitt's Harry Stokes were able to crack the "Big Three" as State swept through six straight dual meets without a loss.

The "Big Three" placed con-

sistently high in the IC4A's and the Lions defeated Army by a wide margin.

But Houston had too much in the NCAA meet and State dropped to fourth. The best Lion performance came from Norman, who finished sixth.

Werner feels he has the material for a good season, but unless he can come up with runners to round out the fourth, fifth and sixth spots in his lineup he isn't counting on any championships.

Last year as a starter he hiked those figures to 30 of 89 for 448 yards and five scores. In addition, he has rushed for 235 yards in 64 carries in two campaigns.
