

State, West Chester Open '61 Soccer Season Here

At least six new faces will be in the lineup when the Penn State booters open the season here against highly regarded West Chester today at 11 a.m. on the new soccer field, opposite the ice rink.

Coach Ken Hosterman will bank on new faces to carry much of the load against the powerful Rams.

Sophomores Tom Flanagan, Dieter Heinze, and Bill Manke all will start their first varsity game, as will juniors Ed Hinojosa and Wentzel Fisch.

Lion captain and fullback John Miller is hampered with a bad leg and may see only limited action. Miller will start if his leg responds to treatment.

Lettermen Howie Farrer, Val Djurdjevic and Ken Link will join Flanagan and Hinojosa on the front line for the Nittanics. Junior letterman Jay Stormer will join Heinze and Fisch at halfback in an attempt to silence West Chester's big scoring guns, Captain Bill Fulk and All-American Don Williams. State's "G-men", Dave Grubbs and Jim Gottschling will divide the goal tending chores.

With only three regulars missing from last year's third place NCAA team, the Rams should prove quite a hurdle for the "Young Lions."

The Rams roared to an 11-1-1 record last year, losing only to national champion St. Louis University, 2-1. One of their 11 wins was over State, 5-0. The 6'3" Williams booted three goals in that game from 25 yards out. He ended up with 10 goals and 5 assists and, along with graduated Barry Rembly, made the All-American squad.

Joining the big center forward on the front line will be captain Fulk, who also crashed 10 goals through enemy nets in 1960. Mike Woolley and Bruce Young, last year's regular wings, both return for another season. Letterman Joe Brownholtz completes the all-veteran front line for the Rams. These five accounted for 28 of the

38 West Chester goals scored last year.

Back from the defense that held the opposition to eight goals in 12 games are halfbacks Bob Boyer, Bill Killen, and Harold Hefflinger, fullback Jerry Yeagley, and goalie John Juenger.

The only team to score twice against these slick vets was St. Louis. Juenger had 113 saves to his credit in 11 games last season.

The only position that will not be manned by a letterman is left fullback, All-American Rembly's old spot.

For Ram coach Mel Lorback (37-4-5) today's game will be just one of many tough ones on his

schedule. Lorback's fifth year as head coach should be a rough one, as the Rams play such powerhouses as the University of Baltimore, Temple University, Navy, Army, Pitt, N.Y.U. and Duke.
