

# Harriers Open Today Against 'Weak' Pitt

Penn State's cross country team will open its dual meet season against Pitt at 1 p.m. today on the golf course, but Lion coach Chick Werner doesn't think the Panthers will provide a true test of his squad's ability.

"We'll win both the varsity and freshman meets against Pitt," Werner said when asked about the meet.

It's uncommon for Werner to make such a prediction, but the fact remains that Pitt is not in the same class as State.

The Panthers lost their first meet of the season to Slippery Rock, one of the best small college squads in the East.

In fact, Slippery Rock is such a power this year that their coach wanted to run against the Lions last week in a practice meet, but it was impossible to fit it into the schedule.

Werner has three solid men returning this year. Gerry Norman and Steve Moorhead, who along with the departed Herm Weber led the Lions to the IC4A title last year, give Werner two seasoned veterans. Howie Deardorff, another experienced hand, was just a step behind these three on last year's squad.

Newcomer Joe Nichols could move into the number four spot, but he is untested and a big question mark.

The other eight men who will be running today will be chosen from a group that includes Mike Miller, Ernie Noll, Lionel Bassett, Fred Larson, Don Hendricks, Bob Miller, Don Woodward, Carl Landis, Ed Smith, Pete Olexy, Mike Sheedy, Tom Mettrick, Mike Wal-

lington, Angelo Pone, Dave La Hoff, and Terry Henderson.

After the Pitt meet the Lions will face Cornell, Michigan State, Navy and Manhattan in dual meets.

Werner said that Michigan State is the most dangerous of these.

"They have some great sophomores who can knock many of last year's varsity men right out of their starting positions," he said.

Michigan State gave State its toughest competition last year. The Lions just squeaked out a 21-22 win over the Spartans in a dual meet. They have Clay Ward, their number one runner, back to harass the Lions this year.

The Lion freshman team will also open its season against Pitt this afternoon. Werner and frosh coach Norm Gordon have adopted a wait and see attitude about the freshmen.

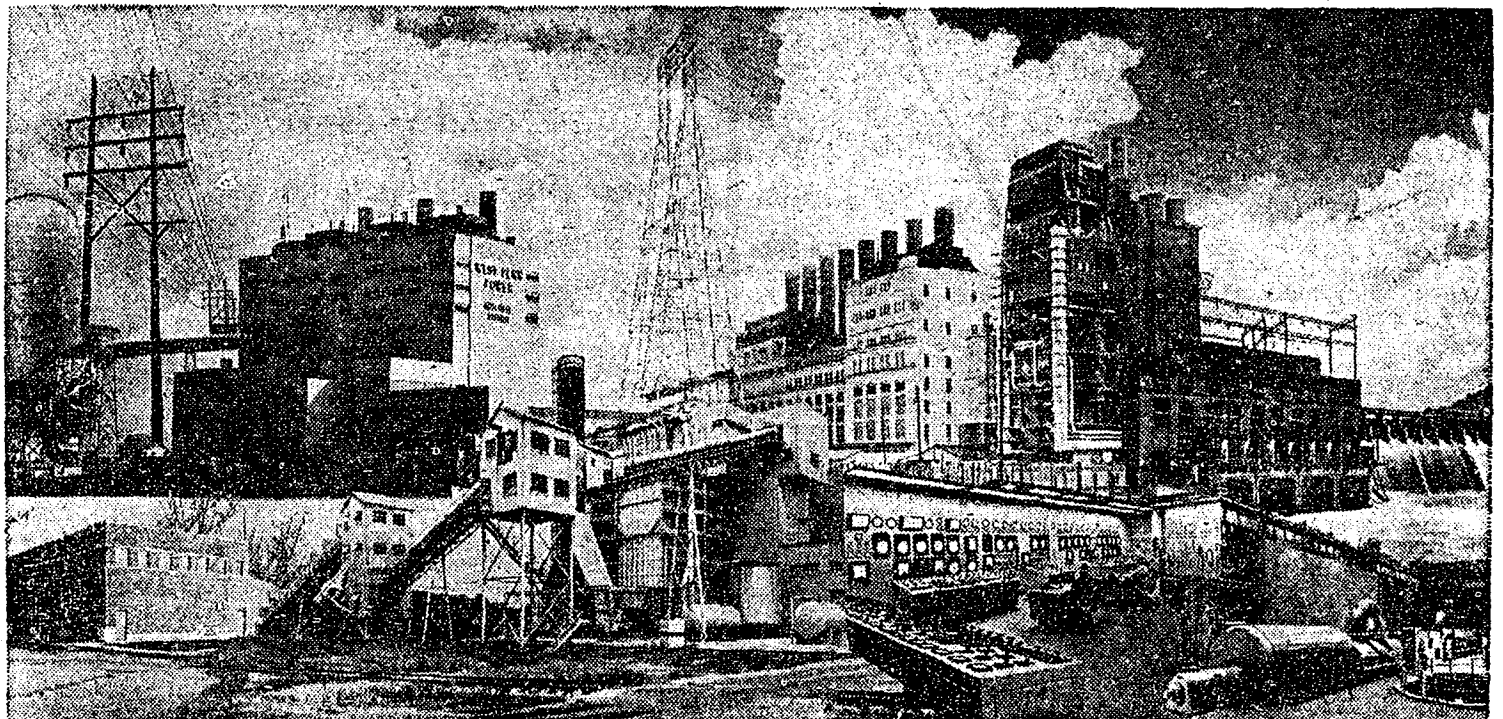
