BRINK OF LIFE was made in 1958 and is based upon a novel of Ulla Isaksson (the woman who wrote the screenplay for the overpowering Bergman-directed THE VIRGIN SPRING). The setting of BRINK OF LIFE is a maternity hospital, the camera is devastating in its almost documentary approach. But this film, like the best of the film as a contemporary art form, is full of a strange compassion, a compassion which is impersonal and yet highly authentic.

If Bergman's THE SEVENTH SEAL is to be considered a treatise on death, then so must BRINK OF LIFE be considered a treatise on life. This film is not open to the criticism of being symbol-ridden. It is blunt, poignant, and as simple as the greatest works of cinematic art.
