

# Two Coeds Placed On Probation

Two coeds were placed on disciplinary probation, one from Oct. 12 until the end of the term, and the other until the end of next term, the dean of women's office announced yesterday.

The two girls, who appeared last week before the Senate Sub-Committee on Discipline, had failed to sign out a week ago Saturday night, and had also failed to come in at closing hours, Dorothy J. Lipp, dean of women, said.

Daniel R. Leasure, assistant to the dean of men, explained that two men, who also appeared before the sub-committee last week and were subject to disciplinary action, had gone to the Hetzler Union earlier that evening and met the coeds.

The foursome went for a ride and parked in the vicinity of the University sawmill. When they thought to check the time, Leasure reported, it was after 1 a.m. and the residence halls were locked.

To avoid getting into trouble by returning late to the residence halls, Leasure explained, one of the coeds decided to stay in a friend's apartment downtown and the other to sleep overnight in the car.

Because the men didn't feel that the coed should stay by herself in the car overnight, one of them volunteered to stay with her. Leasure said. Campus patrolmen found the car early Sunday morning with the coed sleeping in the back seat and the male student sleeping in the front seat of the car.

# Couple Specializes in Planning Business District Remodeling

One of the little known husband and wife teams at the University is Sophia and Milton S. Osborne, who specialize in improving the general level of beauty and efficiency of the business districts of Pennsylvania towns.

"We work under the theory that many business districts that need remodeling can be improved without any major structural changes," Milton S. Osborne, head of the architectural department said recently.

"Mrs. Osborne who is a professional artist handles the color part of the revamping since she

has had a great deal of experience with color," Osborne added. He recommends the structural changes.

The Osbornes have recently helped "facelift the business districts" of Gettysburg, Carlisle and Hollidaysburg. "In our project we strive to retain the architectural character of the towns and also of the individual buildings," Osborne said.

"Our program is one of conserving the buildings with character and avoiding tearing such buildings down. This is where our projects would differ from a complete clearance and rebuilding program. Our program is also far less expensive," he added.
