

'Block' To Re-Check Members

A double check of all students entering the Block "S" section at future football games will be instituted at tomorrow's game against Syracuse, Robert Dufner, president of the club said yesterday.

The check is necessary, he said, because seating officials at Beaver Stadium reported that approximately 1,000 students tried to enter the club's section at the Army game last Saturday. The section has a capacity of 704.

Dufner reported that Edward Czekaj, business manager of athletics and physical education, speculated that non-Block "S" club members who tried to enter the section last week, either had illegal duplicates of a membership card or had re-used cards which may have been smuggled out of the section.

To prevent this from happening at future games, Dufner said that a member of the club will be stationed at the entrance to each row of the section to re-check the cards of members entering the rows.

There will also be a member stationed at the rear of the section to prevent people within the section from giving their cards to non-members who wish to sit in the Block "S" area.

Dufner also announced that there will be a series of moving stunts performed by the club at tomorrow's game. He said that because the rain prevented practice of these stunts at the Army game, there will be a pre-game practice tomorrow.

All members of the club are required to be at the stadium by 12:15 p.m. The section will be
