

Tickets Still Available For Ballet

More than half of the student tickets for the American Ballet Theatre performance at 8 p.m. Sunday in Recreation Hall are still available.

Students are entitled to a free ticket to the University Artists' Series production upon presentation of a matriculation card. Tickets will be available from 9 a.m. to noon and 1 to 5 p.m. at the Hetzel Union desk today and tomorrow.

The co-director of the Ballet, is Oliver L. Smith, a 1959 graduate of the University who has since become a stage designer and producer in New York.

After graduating with a bachelor of arts degree, Smith went to New York and worked as a theatre usher until he got his "break" — a commission to do the settings for the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo's "Saratoga."

Later Smith joined Jerome Robbins and Leonard Bernstein to work on "Fancy Free" for the American Ballet Theatre.

It was this work which led to his being named the Ballet's co-director with Lucia Chase in 1945, a position he has held since then. As a result of this appointment, Smith simultaneously launched a "second" career as a producer.

Smith's association with such Broadway hits as "Antie Mame," "My Fair Lady," "Camelot," "High Button Shoes" and "Brigadoon" has won for him the Sam S. Shubert Foundation gold medal for "outstanding contributions" to the New York legitimate theatre.

Smith has also won five Antoinette Perry Awards which are given annually by the American Theatre Wing.

(Continued from page one) an educational TV network throughout the state," Carpenter said.

The University's station would be a "TV axis" between Pittsburgh and Philadelphia. The same system could probably be established for radio, he said.

"The passage of the bill would not help the University, however, unless we had the station first," Carpenter said.

The University has filed an appeal in the District of Columbia Circuit Court of Appeals protesting an FCC ruling that a commercial station may not be established at the University.

According to an FCC law, no commercial stations may be less than 170 miles apart. The distance from the University to the nearest Channel 3 outlet, for which the University applied, is 158 miles.

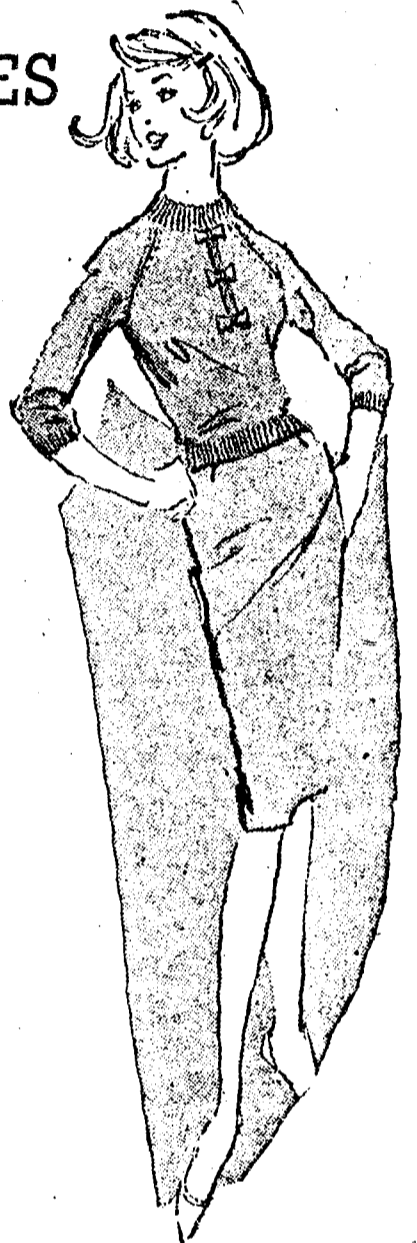
