The play will run through Dec. 2 with performances every Friday and Saturday evening.

"The Cave Dwellers" is a story about a group of people living in an abandoned theater on New York's east side. The characters include a has been actress, an ex-prize fighter, and a young girl.

The play first opened on Broadway in October 1957.

The Ballet has presented 103 productions in 22 years, 32 of which were world premiers.

They were also the first American ballet troupe to make a State Department tour of countries behind the iron curtain. In addition to the Soviet Union, the Ballet has visited Poland, Rumania, Yugoslavia, and Bulgaria.

In 1954, the Ballet Theatre founded a workshop. The workshop prepares and presents works of young choreographers and new composers in off-Broadway theatres. Leonard Bernstein, Jerome Robbins and Agnes de Mille are some of the more famous "graduates" of the workshop.

The American Ballet Theatre Orchestra, which will be conducted by Kenneth Schermerhorn and Walter Hagen for its campus appearance, has recorded 17 of its musical scores. Among these are "Swan Lake," "Sleeping Beauty," "Fancy Free" and "Les Patineurs."

Nearly 650 Tickets Available For Jazztet Concert Tomorrow

Approximately 650 tickets remain for the Jazztet concert, sponsored by the Penn State Jazz Club, at 8 p.m. tomorrow in Schwab.

The Jazztet, an instrumental sextet, features Art Farmer on trumpet and Benny Golson on tenor saxophone, the co-leaders of the group.

The sextet was formed in 1959, when Farmer and Golson both decided to form groups of their own. Each tried to hire the other, before they decided to combine. The group has since played on the Steve Allen TV show and at many of the top summer jazz festivals.

Farmer, who has played with the Gerry Mulligan Quintet and Lionel Hampton's Orchestra, was with Mulligan when they recorded the score of the movie "I Want to Live." He has also played in "The Subterraneans" and "Jazz on a Summer's Day."

Golson, besides playing saxophone, is well-known as a composer and arranger. He wrote the group's recent best selling record, "Killer Joe."

In addition to Farmer and Golson, the Jazztet is composed of Tom McIntoch on trombone; Cedar Walton, piano; Albert Heath, drums; and Thomas Williams, string bass.
