

Experience, Ability Desired by 'Corps'

This is the first article in a series discussing the various phases of the Peace Corps program.

There is no maximum age limit for persons wishing to volunteer for the Peace Corps, but they must be at least 18 years of age.

Married couples without children under 18 years of age may also be accepted into the Corps if they both volunteer and qualify for the same Peace Corps project. All volunteers must be citizens of the United States.

Most of the volunteers for the 15 Peace Corps projects now in operation are in their twenties but several persons 50 years of age or older have been selected for training in some of the projects.

Regardless of the volunteer's age, he must pass the physical and psychological examinations administered by the Peace Corps. He must also have the technical or practical knowledge and ability needed for the project.

A college education is not necessary to fulfill the requirements for projects in any of the fields. But practical experience, technical ability, physical stamina and emotional stability are key qualifications for a Peace Corps volunteer.

In addition to the above qualifications, volunteers must also be able to adapt themselves to unfamiliar surroundings. They will be working in a new environment and climate with people of all races, religions and cultures.

The stated goal of Peace Corps projects is to help raise the standard of living in under-developed countries and to give the volunteer an opportunity to broaden his own horizons and learn while teaching and helping others.

The first step in volunteering for the two-year period of service in the Peace Corps is to file a questionnaire with Peace Corps headquarters in Washington. Interested persons may obtain questionnaires by contacting the State College Post Office or by writing to the Peace Corps, Washington 25, D.C.

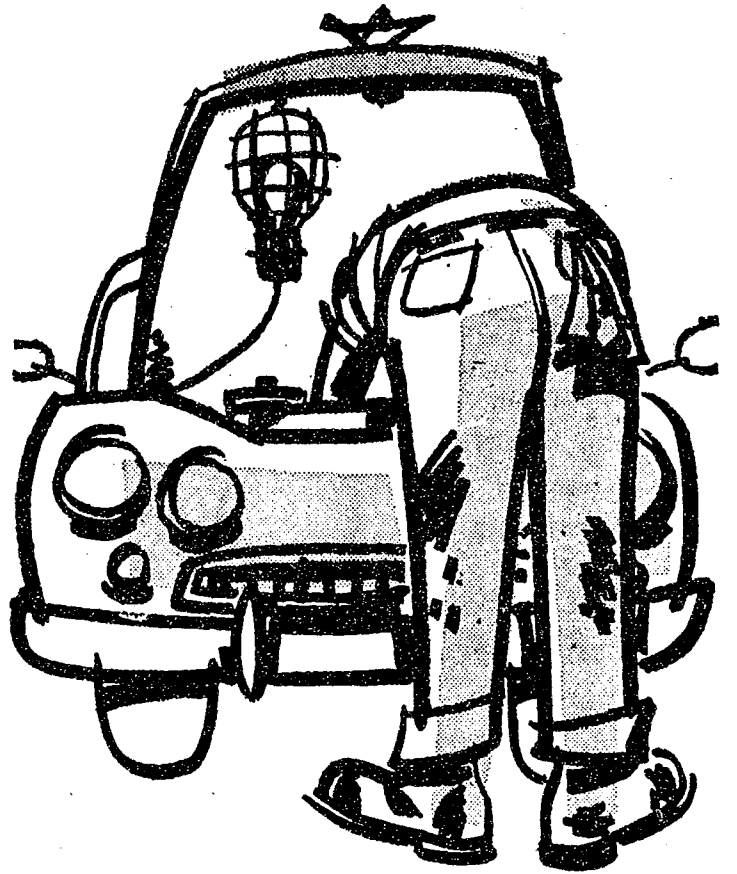
