the crowning of Miss Agriculture of 1961. The winner will be selected from 10 girls nominated by student clubs on Ag Hill and by the agriculture fraternities.

Tickets for the party are being sold for \$1.25 at the Hetzel Union desk and in the offices of the department heads in the College of Agriculture.

the case and a written account of the procedure to be followed prior to the hearing, that he may request a Collegian reporter to be present at the hearing, and that he be present at all discussion during the hearing except for the final decision of the case.

Other recommendations proposed by the workshop included seeking permission from Food Service and administrative officials for the privilege of campaigning in the dining and residence halls, and requesting that students be informed of reasons for new administrative policies or for refusals of student requests, such as the parking proposal.
