

# Kochman Leads Backs With 362 Yards Gained

Roger Kochman, who has picked up 107 yards in each of Penn State's past two games, continues to lead all Lion backs in yardage gained on the ground this season.

Kochman has gained 362 yards on 65 carries, over 100 more than runnerup Dave Hayes.

After a slow start Kochman came on strong in the wins over Syracuse and California, and now he's the ball carrier that State depends on to keep the offense moving.

And Kochman is right behind Junior Powell in pass receptions with seven catches for 122 yards and two touchdowns.

Kochman and Galen Hall teamed up to get State off on the right foot in each of the past two games. Hall hit Kochman with a 44-yard aerial for State's first touchdown against Syracuse and last Saturday Hall hit his left halfback with a 36-yard scoring toss to bring the Lions to within a point of California, 10-9.

Hall hit Bob Mitinger with a two-point conversion pass on the next play and State was off to

the races.

Powell has the highest average-per-carry, 6.2, with 118 yards in 19 rushes. Kochman is next with a 5.2 average followed by Don Jonas with a 4.8 average.

Powell leads in the pass-receiving department with 10 catches for 193 yards and two touchdowns. The little halfback came into his own last week, picking up 88 yards in 10 carries and hauling in two passes for 54 yards and a touchdown.

Powell, who takes a back seat only to Kochman when it comes to speed, makes the Lions a definite outside threat when he's in the game.

Hall is the leader in total offense with 394 yards in 57 plays. The senior quarterback has completed 20 of 38 passes for 338 yards and four touchdowns and has rushed for 56 yards in 19 carries and another TD.

Kochman is close behind with his 362 yards on the ground and Hayes is third with 232 yards.

An interesting fact revealed by the team statistics is that the Lions have had to punt only 22 times in six games while the opposition has been forced to kick 44 times.

State has rushed for 1,300 yards in six games while holding the opposition to 787. The Lions have passed for 779 yards against 596 for the opponents.

## Minor Injuries Plague Lions

Although Penn State is plagued with a bevy of minor injuries going into Saturday's game with Maryland at College Park, Reddie Unit halfback Gary Wydman is the only grizzer who definitely will not play.

Wydman is still suffering from a bruised chest that he sustained in the Syracuse game.

Guard Harrison Rosdahl and tackle Gerry Farkas have been bothered by knee injuries, but team physician Alfred H. Griess said that both are progressing well and should see some action against Maryland.

Guards Dick Wilson and Bob Hart, hampered with knee injuries, also should be ready to play.

The picture on Dave Robinson is less clear. The big end, sidelined with a shoulder separation since the Navy game, has participated in light contact work this week but Coach Rip Engle said that he is still very much on the doubtful list.
