Commenting on injuries received to the face and head during the 1958 season the committee said: "A significant factor in the injuries is that a mouthpiece was not being worn in 93 per cent of the cases where there was a head injury of some kind. In contrast, win the big games in the clutch, face guards were worn 99 per cent of the time."
