

Chem-Phys Loan Fund Approved by Trustees

The Chem-Phys Student Council announced Wednesday night that the University's Board of Trustees has approved the establishment of a \$640 loan fund for students in the College of Chemistry and Physics.

The fund, which will come from the council treasury, will be available for three years to seniors in the College of Chemistry and Physics. By 1964, the loans will be available to both juniors and seniors in the college.

Ralph N. Krecker, director of student aid and Floyd L. Carnahan, assistant dean of the College of Chemistry and Physics, will award the loans on the basis of financial need and character. All

applicants must also have a 2.0 All-University average and be students in the College of Chemistry and Physics.

The loan provides that there be no interest charged until after the recipients graduate. There will be a 2 per cent interest charge for after the first year of graduation; 4 per cent for the second, and 6 per cent charged for the third and each following year.

Applications for the loan are available in the Office of Student Aid.
