

# Booters Lose in Best Effort

## West Point Soccermen Triumph, 4-2

 WEST POINT, N.Y., Nov. 17 —Although Penn State's soccer team played its finest game of the season today, it was not enough to pull out a victory against Army here. The final result, a 4-2 victory for the Cadets, ended all hopes for a winning season for the Lions.

The booters will conclude their season against Pitt Tuesday. A victory will give the Lions a 4-5 record.

The game, played on a muddy field, found the Lions running the Cadets into the ground for almost three periods. In fact, Army coach Joe Palone called this year's team the finest State squad to ever appear at West Point.

Lion Coach Ken Hosterman was quick to agree with Palone. "We played the greatest first half of the season," Hosterman said. "We played Army off the field in the first half. Our team gave an all-out effort and I think they just tired out in the latter stages of the third period."

After a scoreless first period in which the Lions outshot Army 5-2, Dick Entlick put the Cadets in front on a head shot at 13:10 of the second stanza. Frank Kelly crossed the ball across the goal and Entlick beat Lion goalie Dave Grubbs with a shot into the upper right hand corner.

Exactly two minutes later, Ken Link tied the score. State forward Val Djurdjevic set up the score with a pass to Link.

All the Lion forward had to do was head it into the upper right hand corner.

State went ahead at 3:58 of the third period when sophomore Tom Flanagan beat goalie Art Brown with a shot into the upper right hand corner.

At this point, State seemed to be in command of the game. Army, however, turned a possible defeat into victory by tallying two goals later in the third period.

Paul Kirkegaard evened the score at 2-2 with a shot from the left side at 8:30 and Kelly pushed the Cadets ahead to stay with a free kick at 11:40. Center forward Dyne Candon added an insurance goal for the Cadets at 16:40 of the final period when he beat Grubbs with a head shot, perfectly set up by Doe Samaniego.

The Cadets outshot the Lions, 22-21, although State held the upper hand in the first half, 10-6. Grubbs made 15 saves compared to Brown's 10.

### SIX LINEMEN AND THREE BACKS

will make the final home appearances of their varsity football careers this afternoon when Penn State tangles with Holy Cross at Beaver Stadium. Many fans will have their last chance to see State's All-America candidate, Bob Mitinger. The 215-pound end, who Cal Coach Marv Levy calls "the greatest football player in the United States," has played before a host of pro scouts almost every Saturday this fall. The position expected to suffer most from graduation is center. Bill Saul and Jay Huffman, both 3-year veterans, are considered by many coaches to be the best pair of centers in the East. Dick Wilson, who will be starting only his second varsity

### game, will be lost from the guard corps.

Wilson last week was named to the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference all-East squad for his outstanding play against West Virginia. The other linemen leaving will be tackle and captain Jim Smith and end Jim Schwab. Smith has been one of State's most dependable linemen and Schwab is rated the most improved player on the squad. From the backfield, the Lions will lose Galen Hall, the starting quarterback for the past two seasons, Don Jonas, State's all-around halfback, and Tony Wayne. Hall and Jonas have been frontliners for three seasons while Wayne has seen little action since his sophomore year.
