

# Hennessey Praises Lions For Hard-Hitting Defense

A battered and bruised Tom Hennessey had nothing but praise for Penn State in the Holy Cross dressing room following the 34-14 loss at Beaver Stadium Saturday.

"I've never been hit so hard in all my life," the Crusader left halfback said as he wiped some of the blood from his

face. "I hear that State keyed on Davis when they played Syracuse. Well, if they were hitting then like they were today, I sure would hate to be that poor kid."

Hennessey said he was impressed with the end play of Bob Mitinger and Jim Schwab. "Although they weren't in on many tackles, they kept us boxed in and we couldn't get around them," Hennessey said.



Quarterback Pat McCarthy was also high in his praise of the Nittanians. "They're the best team we've played all year," he said. "That line is really fantastic. They're big and they move quickly. That 74 (Jim Smith) was in our backfield all afternoon."

Although Crusader coach Eddie Anderson was disappointed with the loss, he was nevertheless realistic about it. "Sure, I'm disappointed about our loss, but I realize that Penn State is out of our class," the veteran coach said. "We don't belong in the same league," he added.

Anderson said the Lions have a well-rounded club. "What makes the team so potent is the fact that they can kill you on the ground with their ball control game, and then come back with a real fine passing attack."

State rolled up 380 yards rush-

ing and passed for 98 yards in marching to 26 first downs.

Anderson sidestepped reporters' questions asking him to compare the Lions with Syracuse. "They're both fine clubs," he said. "I wouldn't want to make a comparison of the two."

Between stages of dressing, tackle John Timperio lauded both State's backfield and line. "We knew that Kochman was a real good power runner," Timperio said, "but that Torris runs like a tank. He has the ability to bounce off tacklers, which makes him even tougher to bring down."

Timperio said he thought the State line was rugged and tough. "They hit hard and for keeps," he said. "When you are blocked, you know it. On the opening kickoff No. 62 (Joe Blasenstein) hit me so hard that I thought my ribs had caved in."

## Gogolkiewicz Breaks Rifle Records

Dick Gogolkiewicz fired a record breaking 292 to lead the Penn State varsity rifle team to a 1417-1379 victory over Pitt Saturday at the losers' rifle range.

Gogolkiewicz's 292 out of a possible 300 broke the Pitt rifle range record and also marked the highest total ever fired by a State shooter.

The victory for State was its second, the first coming last month against Lehigh by a 1409-1401 score.

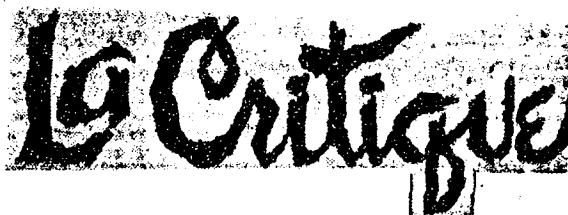
Other scorers for Penn State were Bill Gutteron 279, Ron Dankesreiter 279, Bill Shaffer 283 and
