Bluebonnet Still Keeps Door Open

a bid to Syracuse and the Gator Bowl has already announced that Maryland has accepted a conditional bid, pending Saturday's season finale with Virginia.

The Bluebonnet Bowl, at Houston, Texas, hasn't closed the door on State yet, but the Lions are only one of a host of teams still being considered.

Bill Whitmore, publicity director for the bowl, said in a telephone interview yesterday that off its performance the past two weeks State "has to be considered" for the "guest" berth.

Whitmore said that at present his best guess for a host team is Arkansas.

The Lions continued to prove that they have one of the finest offensive attacks in the nation Saturday. Time and time again Kochman and Torris barreled through gaping holes up front and when it was all over statistics showed that Torris had gained 144 yards and Kochman 133.

Kochman scored State's first three touchdowns, two in the first period and one in the second. Crusader quarterback Pat McCarthy threw two 41-yard TD aeriels to halfback Al Snyder to narrow the gap to 21-14 at the end of three quarters. But Torris ran over, through and around numerous Holy Cross defenders for State's final two scores in the fourth quarter.

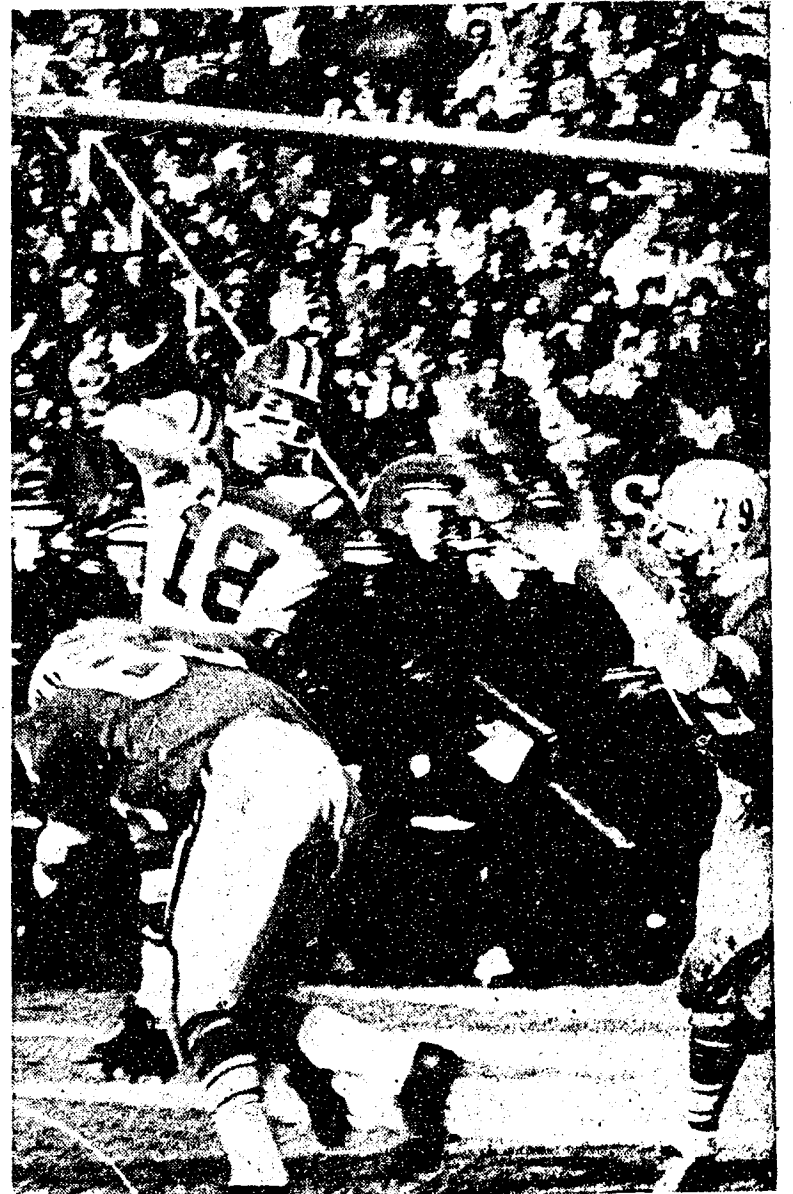
After the game Lion coach Rip Engle praised Kochman, Torris

Unbeaten Rutgers moved into third place, followed by Navy, Columbia, Army, Pittsburgh, Villanova, Boston College and Princeton in that order.

Liberty Eyes Orange

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—The Liberty Bowl expects to select the host team today for its Dec. 16 game, with Syracuse and Penn State the top candidates.

If it wants the bid, despite last week's heart-breaking 17-15 loss to Notre Dame, Syracuse appears to have the edge. Syracuse is 6-3 on the season with Boston College left to play.

The "visiting" team is expected to come from Rice, Duke, Army, Navy, Florida, Utah State, and Colorado.

Gator Offers Terps Bid

COLLEGE PARK, Md. (AP)—The University of Maryland was offered yesterday and will accept an invitation to play New Year's Day in the Gator Bowl at Jacksonville, Fla., if it beats Virginia Saturday.
