

# 300 Pounds of Turkey Left Over

About 300 pounds of turkey are left over from the 6,000 pounds sent to the residence halls for the Thanksgiving meal, Stanley H. Campbell, director of housing and food service, said yesterday. Of the 4,338 people served in the dining halls, 168 were guests.

men's and dean of women's staffs also ate in the dining halls with the students. Contrary to popular belief, turkey will not be served within the immediate future, Campbell said.


## Prof Gets Meyer Award
