general lack of communication between students in the various disciplines points to the need for a Graduate Student Center, he said.

"Neither the University Club, a private institution, nor Irvin or Grange Halls, graduate residences, provide suitable facilities for the interchange of graduate viewpoints," he said.

"The overall education program would undoubtedly be enhanced through the provision of such a center which might include a cafeteria, lounge, bridge and chess rooms and a library."
