

# Saul, Smith, Sign Pro Pacts

Bill Saul, one of Penn State's two fine centers, has signed a professional football contract with the Baltimore Colts of the National Football League.

Saul is the second member of the Lions' Gator Bowl champions to sign a pro contract. Captain Jim Smith, a 230-pound tackle, inked a Los Angeles Ram pact immediately after the game in Jacksonville, Fla., Dec. 31.

Saul, a second round draft choice of the Colts, had also received an offer from the Buffalo Bills of the American Football League. Smith had been drafted by the New York Titans of the AFL.

Smith, who will play in tomorrow's Senior Bowl All-Star game in Mobile, Ala., said he received a good offer with a "no-cut clause." The Rams plan to use Smith at either offensive guard or defensive end.

Saul's signing came as somewhat of a surprise. The 215-pounder, who teamed with Jay Huffman to give State what Engle called "the finest pair of centers in the country," had planned to delay signing until after the baseball season. A pitcher, he had a 2.07 earned run average for the 1961 Lion nine.

Four of the other seven Lions drafted by the pros are still being pursued by the football scouts. Halfbacks Roger Kochman and Al Gursky and tackle Charlie Sieminski have another year of eligibility, but halfback Don Jonas, guard Dick Wilson

and ends Bob Mitinger and Jim Schwab have all been contacted by the pros.

Schwab, Wilson and Jonas are all draft picks of the Philadelphia Eagles and have been contacted by General Manager Vince McNally. Schwab and Wilson have indicated a preference for the NFL, but Jonas is undecided.

Mitinger, who will play in Sunday's Hula Bowl in Honolulu, was drafted by the Washington Redskins in the third round and fifth by the San Diego Chargers of the AFL.

"There's no sense hurrying," Mitinger said. "I'm going to wait awhile before I decide." The pros will probably use Mitinger as a linebacker.

Gursky, used primarily as a defensive replacement for Roger Kochman in 1961, was drafted 12th by the New York Giants.

# Huffman Heads All-Opponent Teams

Center Jay Huffman, a starter in 32 consecutive Penn State football games, seems to be making a clean sweep of All-Opponent teams.

The highly-underrated senior has already been named to All-Opponent teams selected by the Navy, West Virginia, Syracuse and Pitt football squads.

Mitinger and tackle Jim Smith landed spots on the Syracuse "toughest" list. Notre Dame was the only other team to land as many as three players on the Orange All-Opponent team.

Penn State will select its All-

Opponent team at the annual football banquet Jan. 23. All members of teams faced in the regular season and Georgia Tech, State's foe in the Gator Bowl, are eligible.
