Dominican Republic Sanctions Ended

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Council of the Organization of American States (OAS) yesterday removed all economic and diplomatic sanctions against the Dominican Republic.

Twenty nations voted for removal. The 21st — Cuba — abstained.

In taking the action, the council said the Dominican Republic no longer constitutes a threat to the peace and security of the Americas.

Sukarno Threatens Dutch New Guinea

MAKASSAR, Celebes, Indonesia (AP) — President Sukarno, vowed before a cheering crowd that filled Makassar's public square yesterday that Indonesia will take Dutch New Guinea this year, either by talking or fighting.

"No fleet, no army, no force will stop us," he declared.

The Indonesian president delivered the first of five speeches to whip up national fervor in his dispute with the Netherlands.

Katanga Assembly Acts On Secession Ending

ELIZABETHVILLE, Katanga, the Congo (AP) — The Katanga Assembly handed to secret commissions yesterday the task of deciding what to do about ending the secession from the Congo.

Vietnamese Plan Reform Program

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States and South Vietnam announced yesterday sweeping reforms designed to raise Vietnamese living standards and thus strengthen the people's will to resist Communist aggression.

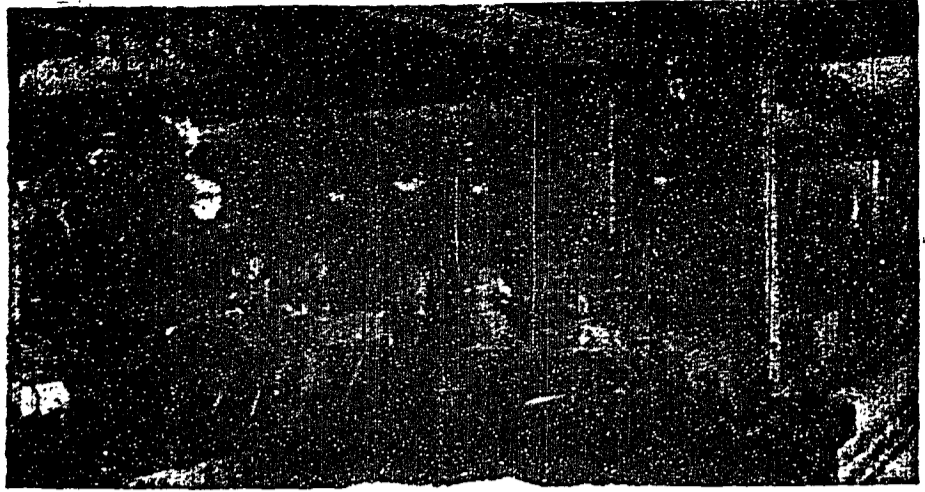
