

\$100,000 Seen as Bowl Proceeds

The University stands to receive in the neighborhood of \$100,000 for the appearance of the football team in the Gator Bowl.

Chester Smith, sports editor of The Pittsburgh Press, estimated Sunday that the University would receive \$120,000. The figure was placed at \$100,000 by Herb Werner, sports editor of the Altoona Mirror.

When contacted, Edward T. Czekaj, business manager for athletics, said that the exact sum which the University will receive will not be known for at least two weeks. But, he termed the report in the Pittsburgh Press as being "all wet."

The money received will be used to expand athletic facilities for students and staff members, Ernest B. McCoy, director of intercollegiate athletics, said before the game.

The primary use of the money will be to pay off part of the costs of the new stadium, McCoy said. This, he said, could not be classified as athletic facilities for students and staff; but, he explained, it will free other funds to provide these facilities.

Funds from previous bowl appearances - or network-televized games have been added to the regular gate receipts from home games to build tennis courts, bowling alleys, the ice rink and other facilities.

The bowling alleys in both

Recreation and White Halls were installed with \$100,000 received from the televised football game with Pennsylvania several years ago, McCoy said.

The ice rink earns only enough money each season to pay for its operating and maintenance expenses, he said. The \$350,000 construction costs for the rink and the roof are being paid for totally through football gate receipts.

The receipts also make it possible to play at a minimum charge on the University golf course, McCoy said.
