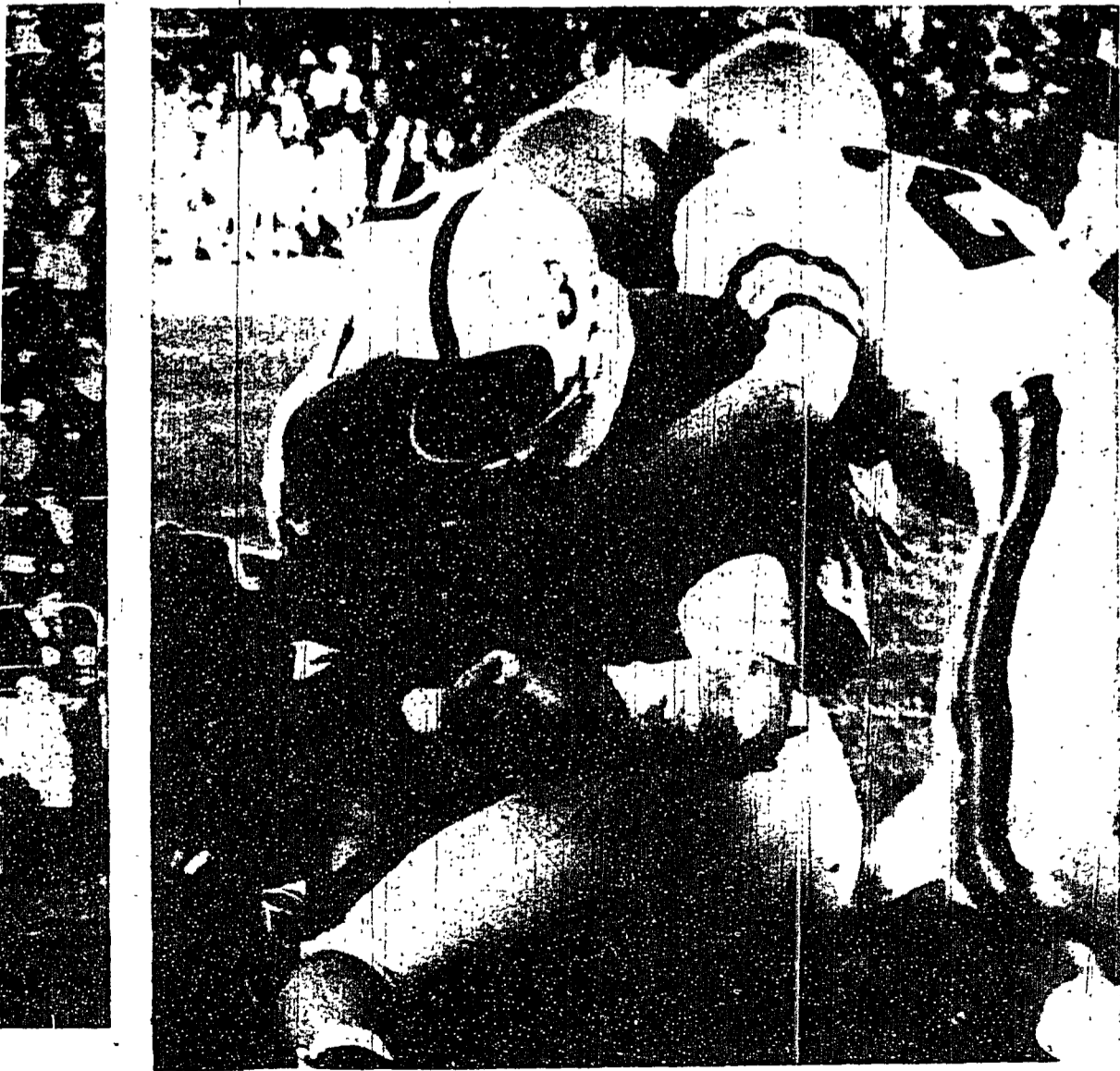

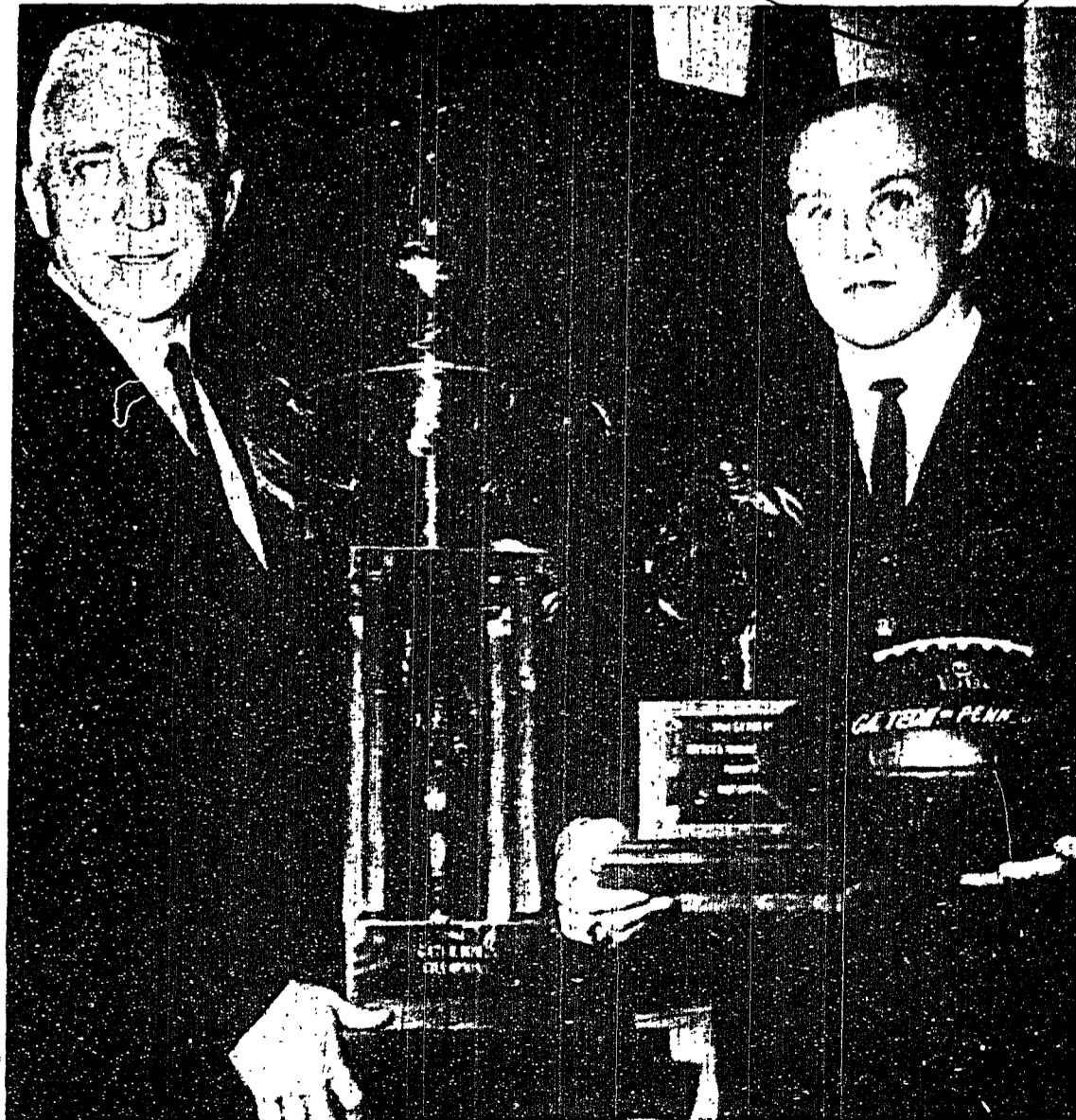
Miami Was Never Like This
