Registration for fraternity rushing has ben extended until 5 p.m. Friday, Steve Zitin. IFC rushing chairman, announced last night. Registration is bing held in the fraternity affairs office, 203-E in the Hetzel Union Building.

Zitin also said that up to this point, approximately 1000 men have registered, a few of these being superclassmen. Of this number only 750 to 800 are eligible to be pledged.
