

# Senate Revises W, Y, Z Regulations

In addition to a new rule which forbids active social organizations from retaining restrictive membership clauses in their constitutions after June 30, 1965 the University Senate also changed and simplified Senate Regulations W, Y and Z yesterday.

The rule changes were proposed in a report by Laurence H. Lattman, chairman of the Senate Committee on Student Affairs.

The other changes were drawn up by the student affairs committee in an effort to put down in simple terms, free of legal terminology, what the University expects of students, Lattman said.

The new regulations condense what were formerly nine rules regarding student conduct into the following five:

**W-11** The University regards all acts of unethical, immoral, dishonest or destructive behavior as serious offenses. A student whose influence is found to be injurious to the standards of morals of the student body, or whose conduct is prejudicial to the good name of the University, may be dismissed by the president.

**W-12** Possession or use of alcoholic beverages on University

property and maintenance of bars, dispensing equipment or similar facilities for storing or serving alcoholic beverages in any student or social unit, are prohibited.

**W-13** The Senate Committee on Student Affairs shall hold student organizations responsible for the good conduct of all persons at all University-related functions and for conformance to the laws of the municipality, commonwealth and nation.

**W-14** Any student who attempts to register for another student or who permits it to be done on his behalf, or who in any way attempts to falsify University records shall be subject to disciplinary action.

**W-15** Details of Senate regulations for undergraduate students shall be embodied in a guidebook which shall be given to each student entering the University.

In addition to the action on discriminatory clauses, the changed Y rules provide that the Senate Committee on Student Affairs shall have authority over all stu-

dent organizations and activities, students on probation shall not participate actively in any extra-curricular activity, and student organizations shall not offer public entertainment without prior authorization.

In addition, only student organizations recognized by the student affairs committee may use University facilities, and all student communications media shall be supervised by a board of directors composed of student and faculty members.

The Z rules concerning social organizations were condensed to one specifying that social functions may be held only in places approved by the dean of men or women.

Lattman said that the rule changes were necessitated by the recognition that students were often unaware of Senate regulations because of their length and complexity. In addition, the change to the term system and an effort to eliminate distinction between the University Park campus and Commonwealth campuses made it necessary to revise the regulations, he said.

## Professor's Tardy Grade Returns Complicate Operations for Registrar

A high percentage of faculty members did not deliver their grade reports for the fall term to the registrar's office by the deadline prescribed, Robert M. Koser, associate registrar, said yesterday.

"This problem must be solved by the end of the winter term if we are to have the student transcripts ready in time for spring term registration," Koser said.

The failure to turn in the fall grade reports did not cause much trouble because there was almost four weeks to prepare the transcripts, Robert G. Bernreuter, registrar, said. However, he added, the registrar's office will have about a week to prepare them at
