ERIE — The new \$675,000 science-engineering building on the Behrend Campus will soon be ready for dedication, according to T. E. Campbell, assistant director of the campus. The new classroom-laboratory building, which will be called the Dr. Otto F. Behrend Science Building, was completely enclosed with the heating system in operation before the winter weather set in. The addition will permit Behrend to double its enrollment. Dr. Otto Behrend was the brother of Ernst Behrend, upon whose estate the campus is located. Dr. Behrend bequeathed \$750,000 to the campus several years ago.

SCRANTON — The first issue of the Scranton Center's newspaper, The Cub's Roar, was published in December. Theresa Sardo, OSGA corresponding secretary, is editor.

A car wash sponsored by the graduating class, has resulted in a profit of \$64, which brings the senior fund to \$118. The money will be used to finance a graduation dinner-dance in June.

UNIVERSITY PARK — Behrend continued its pace in the Western Section of the Commonwealth Campus Sports League through the third round. The Erie team leads its division with unblemished records in table tennis, bowling and chess. Altoona Campus holds second place in bowling and table tennis with 2-1 records, while DuBois and New Kensington are tied for second in chess at 1-1.

In the Southeastern Division, Mt. Alto sports 2-0 records in bowling and chess. The Foresters share their chess lead with York

Campus. In table tennis, York leads its division with a 2-0 log, followed by Wyomissing with 2-1.

Pottsville, last year's league champs in chess, maintained its supremacy with a 3-0 record, to lead the Anthracite Division. Hazleton, with an identical 3-0 log, leads the sector in bowling, while Scranton sports an unblemished record after three matches in table tennis.

Students of the Commonwealth Campuses are now allowed to participate in the student insurance program.
