five months on a tour of 20 col-leges and universities in the discontent, Picon explained that seminars on high levels of soci-

leges and universities in the United States to obtain information on student counselling.

STUDENTS STRIKE and refuse to go to class sometimes as often as six times a year, Picon said, usually because of social and other aspects.

There are few provisions for housing, counselling or placement, and political problems on the national or international level.

One reason for the prevalence of these strikes is the cultural background of the South American countries, he said. A long history of dictatorships did not always allow people to express

always allow people to express their opinions, he explained When freedom came, many people were not prepared for it-since freedom requires a special education, Picon said.


