

Harshbarger Will Speak On 'Crown Thy Good'

Dr. Luther H. Harshbarger, University Chaplain, will speak on "And Crown Thy Good" at the 10:55 a.m. Chapel Services tomorrow in Schwab.

Directed by James W. Beach, the Meditation Chapel Choir will sing "O Thou, the Central Orb" by Orlando Gibbons. Dr. Leonard Raver, Chapel organist, will play "The Morning Star," a pastorate by Daniel Pinkham and a Toccata on "London Tune" by Louis L. White.

In 1949, Dr. Harshbarger came to the University as Executive Secretary of the Penn State Christian Association. He was named University Chaplain in 1955.

DR. HARSHBARGER, a native of Pennsylvania, attended Millersville State Teachers College, Bethany Biblical Seminary School of Music and McPherson College, where he received an A.B. degree. He did graduate work at Temple University School of Theology and at Yale University Divinity

School, where he received his bachelor of divinity degree. Dr. Harshbarger is an ordained minister of the Church of the Brethren.

From 1945 to 1949, Dr. Harshbarger worked with the YMCA in Europe. He received the Officer's Cross of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany for meritorious service to German prisoners of war in Great Britain, Belgium, the Netherlands and Germany.
