

Stevenson Accuses Cuba Of Communist Subversion

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — Adlai E. Stevenson declared yesterday that Cuba is trying to wreck the Alliance for Progress and thus make it easier for Communist subversion to spread throughout Latin America.

The chief U.S. delegate told the United Nation's main Political Committee that is the real reason Cuba sought debate now on her long-standing charges that the United States is contemplating "new plans of aggression" aimed at toppling Prime Minister Fidel Castro's government.

Stevenson spoke in reply to a bitter attack by Cuban Delegate Mario Garcia-Inchaustegui, who charged the United States government with acts of corruption, defamation and even murder in the Western Hemisphere.

HE DECLARED that the U.S. delegation came to the recently concluded meeting of the Organization of American States at Punta del Este "with a bag of gold in one hand and a bloody dagger in the other." The conference voted to exclude Cuba from the inter-American system.

The Cuban delegate asserted his country's political system

based on Marxist-Leninist doctrine "is not negotiable." Stevenson replied that there is plenty of room in the Western Hemisphere for a diversity of economic systems. But he added that "what we cannot accept—what we will not accept" is use of Cuba as the means through which alien powers seek to destroy democratic evolution in the Western Hemisphere.

Governor Gets 2 School Aid Plans

HARRISBURG (AP) — The House decided last night to let Gov. David L. Lawrence resolve its differences over state aid to schools.

It approved two plans for increasing that aid, one backed by the Republicans, the other by the Democrats.

THE ACTION was taken despite a plea by speaker H. G. Andrews a Johnstown Democrat, that leaders of both sides sit down and confer with the governor before taking any legislative action.

The GOP program would spread

Court Stays Ruling

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Reading of the Bible and recitation of the Lord's Prayer in Pennsylvania's public schools may continue as usual until at least April 2, a federal court ruled yesterday. The delay in enforcement of an injunction was granted to permit an expected appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court on the constitutionality of the state's Bible-reading law. As amended in 1959, students may be excused from listening to the Bible verses each day on written notice from their parents or guardian.

Kennedy, Adoula Confer On Congolese Problem

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Kennedy and Premier Cyrille Adoula of the Congo conferred yesterday on the problem of secessionist Katanga and Congolese economic problems.

Press secretary Pierre Salinger said they went into "the desirability of implementing" the Kilon agreement under which Katanga leader Moise Tshombe said he would bring the balky province back under the jurisdiction of the Congolese central government.
