

# Colony to Affiliate With Iota Alpha Pi

The University's Greek family will lose one member at the end of the spring term, but it will almost simultaneously take another into the fold.

The local chapter of Beta Sigma Omicron is planning to deactivate at the end of this year and Beta Colony is preparing for initiation on May 5 into Iota Alpha Pi national sorority the weekend of May 5.

**THE SENATE COMMITTEE** on Student Affairs, chaired by Lawrence H. Lattman, approved Beta Sigma Omicron's request to withdraw their national charter, and the sorority has already notified their national organization.

Also approved by the same committee was Beta Colony's petition to become a member of Iota Alpha Pi.

The local group, has been working almost a full year to become a member of a national group. Linda Mayer, vice president said last night.

The University requires at least 12 coeds to initiate a colony, she explained. Beta Colony began as a local sorority with 20 charter members last spring, Miss Mayer added.

**AFTER A COLONY** is formed the next requirement is to remain a local group for a full year. Then the group may petition to the Senate committee to become members of a national organization.

Beta Colony become a pledge chapter of Iota Alpha Pi Nov. 4, and during formal rush and the open-bidding period the new

pledge chapter added 19 coeds to its group, Miss Mayer said.

The charter members will be initiated into the national group in a separate and earlier ceremony, but the whole chapter will become sisters on the same day, Miss Mayer said.

Two Air Force captains, studying here, were seriously injured Saturday in a head-on collision near Harrisburg in which two Philipsburg women were killed.

Mrs. Eleanor A. Jennings and Miss Darla K. Beach were killed in the accident which occurred on Route 22 a mile west of Newport. Funeral services for the women will be held this afternoon in Philipsburg.

Capt. Alex A. Vivona and Capt. Francis S. Coyle sustained serious head and internal injuries. They were taken to Olmstead Air Base Hospital where they were permanently stationed.

The accident occurred when the car driven by Vivona skidded on an ice patch and hit the Jennings car head-on, State Police said.
