

Hodges to Speak Here Sunday

Luther H. Hodges, U.S. secretary of commerce, will speak on "A World of Competition" at 3 p.m. Sunday in Schwab in the first University Lecture Series of the winter term.

A short question period will follow the talk. There will be a coffee hour in the Hetzel Union Building immediately afterward for all interested persons.

Student tickets will be distributed tomorrow afternoon and all day Thursday through Saturday at the Hetzel Union desk. General admission tickets will be on sale for \$1.25 from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1 to 5 p.m. Thursday through Saturday.

Before being appointed secretary of commerce by President Kennedy last January, Hodges served for six years as governor of North Carolina. Prior to that he was lieutenant-governor of the state.

Hodges, born in Pittsylvania County, Va., in 1898; worked his way from secretary to manager of a textile mill in Leaksville, N.C., to vice president of Marshall Field and Company.

His assignments for the federal government include head of the

Textile Division of Office of Price Administration, 1944, and consultant to the secretary of agriculture, 1945.

Hodges retired from private business in 1950 and spent over a year in West Germany as head of the Industry Division of the Economic Cooperation Administration. In 1951, he acted as consultant to the State Department on the International Management Conference.

Hodges holds a bachelor of arts degree from the University of North Carolina.

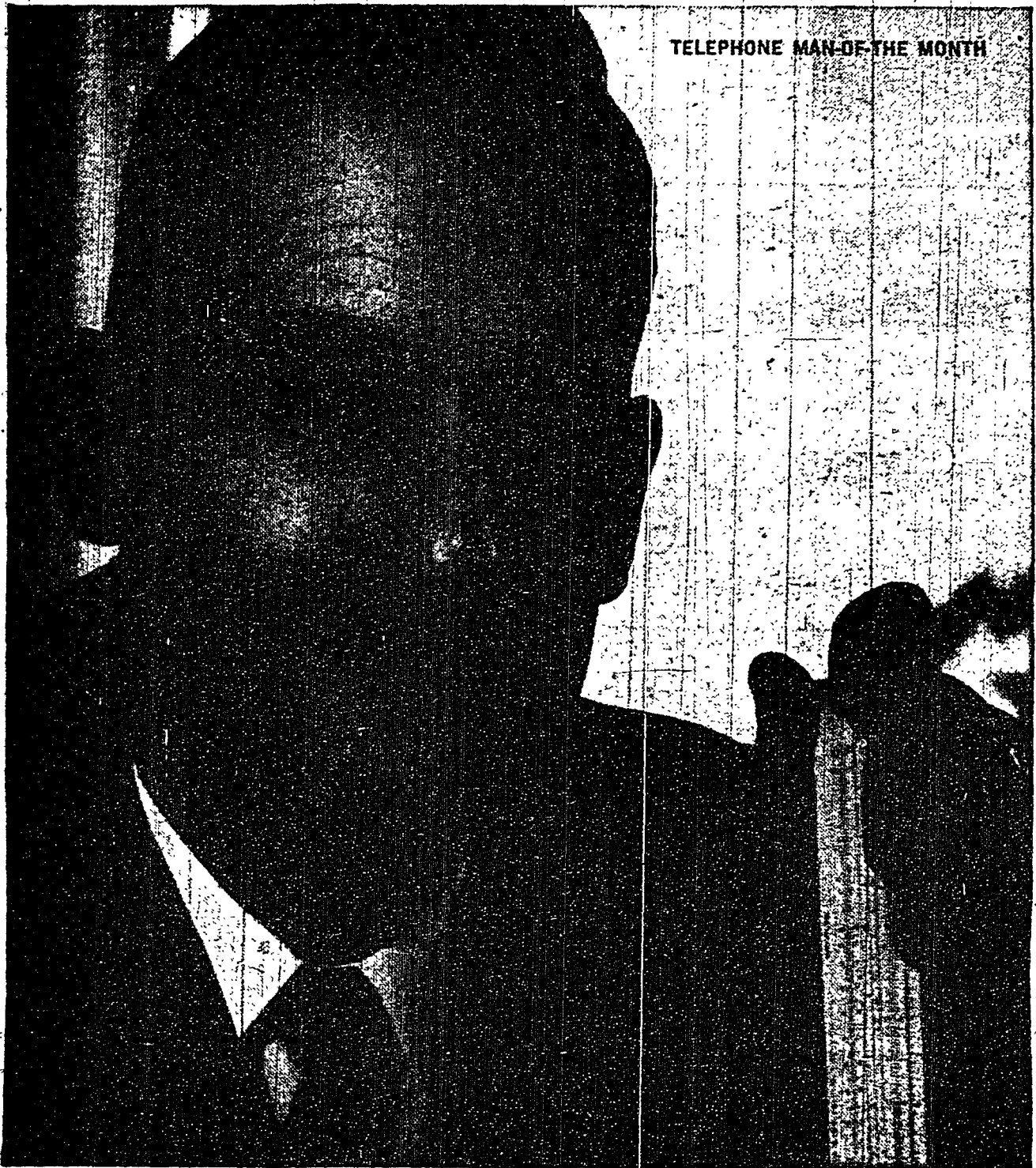
