

Wanner Names 3 Coeds Campaigning Starts To Panhellenic Positions For AWS Offices

Janice Wanner, president of the Panhellenic Council, made three major appointments for the coming year at last night's council meeting.

She named as rush chairman: Marjorie Zelko, Sigma Delta Tau; parliamentarian; Judith Walko, Delta Zeta; and housing chairman: Terry Shaffer, Delta Zeta.

Voting rules and regulations for next week's council officer elections were announced by Pam Chadwick, elections chairman. Election of Panhellenic vice president, treasurer, recording secretary and corresponding secretary will be held Feb. 15.

A check system to insure legal voting procedures will be initiated.

Miss Chadwick said. When a coed wishes to vote, the poll-sitter will check her name on a master list of sorority women's names.

When all the votes are counted, the number of those checked on the master list will be compared to the number of ballots cast. Sorority pledges will also be allowed to vote, Miss Chadwick explained.

Voting facilities will be set up in each dining hall with the exceptions of those in the North and West Halls areas. Voting hours will be from 11:15 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. and 4:30 to 6:30 p.m.

Miss Chadwick asked that the Panel delegates tell their pledges who live in the North and West Halls to vote in the areas in which their sororities suites are located.

Electioneering returned to campus yesterday as candidates for Association of Women Students' offices opened their campaigns for next week's balloting.

Primary elections will be held Tuesday. The nominees with the two highest vote tallies will run in the final elections Feb. 15.

Candidates for AWS president are Judy Allen, sophomore in chemistry, from Pittsburgh, and Janis Somerville, junior in arts and letters from Muncy.

THERE WILL BE no primary for president or first vice president because there are only two candidates for each office, Carol Tomlinson, co-chairman of the elections committee, said yesterday.

Barbara Feit, junior in business administration from Great Neck, N.Y., will oppose Merle Stens, junior in arts and letters from Philadelphia, for first vice president.

Women students will find three offices on their primary ballots—second vice president, secretary and treasurer.

Running for second vice president are Barbara Brown, junior in journalism from Washington, D.C.; Barbara Bruni, freshman in liberal arts from Point Marion; Judy Duquette, freshman in education from Alexandria, Va.; Lynn McTavish, sophomore in home economics from West Ches-

ter; and Sandra Whiteley, sophomore in arts and letters from North Wales.

CANDIDATES FOR AWS secretary are Vicki Caplan, sophomore in rehabilitation education from Pittsburgh; Shannon Klug, sophomore in medical technology from Pittsburgh; Marjorie Moran, freshman in liberal arts from Pittsburgh; Margaret Raney, sophomore in secondary education from Yardley; Jean Ruhl, junior in journalism from Lewisburg; and Emily Workman, freshman in education from York.

The six candidates for treasurer are Joan Adams, sophomore in liberal arts from Pittsburgh; Carole Kersh, sophomore in elementary and kindergarten education from Pittsburgh; Marjorie Porter, sophomore in home economics from Allison Park; Dorothy Ryan, sophomore in elementary and kindergarten education from Lancaster; Carolyn Sadini, junior in business administration from Pittsburgh; and Sherry Zwayer, junior in journalism from Reading.

Boro Council Forms Committee To Study Future Building Code

State College Borough Council formed a building code committee at its monthly meeting Monday night. However, in the opinion of Borough Solicitor Robert Kistler any building code which might be drawn up would have to apply only to future construction.

The committee was charged with consolidating existing state and local regulations which deal with housing. It will also consider the best methods of enforcing existing laws and any new ones which seem necessary.

Council President Lawrence Perez named Edwin Frost, a councilman, to serve as the council's liaison to the committee. A representative of the University and one from the Town Independent Men's Council may be asked to serve in an advisory capacity. Warren N. Underwood, associate professor of civil engineering, has agreed to work as technical advisor to the committee.

THE COMMITTEE is expected to meet within two weeks with Gomer Williams, chairman of the TIM Housing Committee, to discuss the problem faced by independent students. At the meeting, Williams expects to present the TIM Housing report for consideration.
