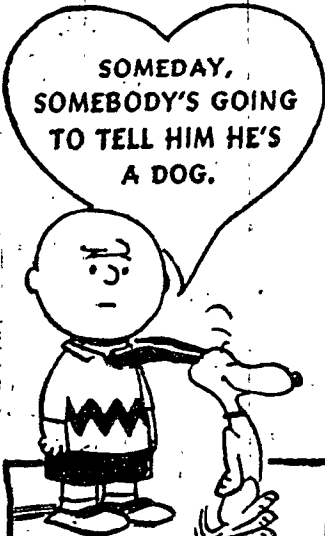

Study Abroad Forms Due

Students who applied for this year's Study Abroad program and were not accepted, will be considered for the 1963 spring term only if they bring their applications up to date before Feb. 15.

New applications will also be accepted up to this date. Dr. Dagobert deLevie, director of the program, said yesterday. The Study Abroad office is located in Sparks.

DeLevie explained that it is impossible for his office to compile new addresses and All-University averages for last year's applicants without their help. Anyone who does not comply, he said, will not be considered for the 1963 program.

Students from any college with at least a 2.5 All-University average and the equivalent of 12 credits of a foreign language may apply for the program. Arrangements are now established in France and Germany, and there may be an extension in a Spanish-speaking country by next year, deLevie said.

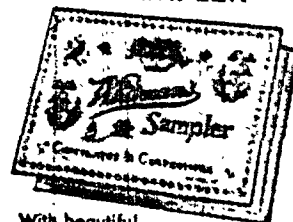
