

DU Top Cage Team; IM Swimming Opens

With only two games remaining to play, Delta Upsilon, the leading team in the IM Basketball Tournament, seems a cinch for the fraternity championship.

Boasting a 6-0 record, DU has scored a total of 344 points, an average of 57.33 per game. Dick Frick, who has averaged 16.5 points in the six games, leads the DU scorers.

The Gailyans (4-0) lead the scoring in the independent division with a 55.2 average. Atop the individual scoring race is Dave Robinson, averaging 16.5 points in two games. Ed Schaeffer, Nittany 42, is the top scorer for one game with 31 points.

TEAMS UNDEFEATED thus far in independent action are Walnut, Linden, Cottonwood, Balsam, Lackawanna, Allegheny, Centre, Mifflin, Cumberland, Mercer, Clearfield, Franklin, Nittany 42, Gailyans and Hatchermen.

In the fraternity division, Triangle, Theta Chi, Phi Sigma Kappa, Delta Upsilon, Beta Theta Pi, Phi Kappa Psi, and Phi Gamma Delta, are unbeaten.

The IM Swimming Tournament will get underway at Glennland Pool today at 5:30 p.m. Scheduled to compete in the first dual meets are Theta Xi and Pi Kappa Alpha, Sigma Phi Epsilon and Sigma Alpha Epsilon, and Phi Epsilon Pi and Tau Phi Delta.

Seven Lion Fencers Watch First Meet

"Coach, can we see the freshman meet? Can we see what it looks like?" These were the requests of Penn State's varsity fencers as they asked coach Dick Klima to let them watch the freshman meet between Johns Hopkins and VMI before the varsity duel Saturday.

Seven of the nine competing Lions were fencing for the first time and had never before seen a meet. Among them were team captain Bob Oliver, who scored the winning 14th point in State's 15-12 triumph, and Larry Charabern, who won all three of his sabre bouts. Only Art Fuller and Earl LaKier had ever seen a fencing meet before Saturday's, which was the first for State since 1951.

KLIMA WAS particularly impressed with the Blue Jays' Tom Ahern, a muscular 6-6 epee man. Ahern was the only Johns Hopkins fencer to win three bouts.

"The first meet was good experience in many ways," Klima said. "We were glad to win, of course, because we hadn't really expected to come close to Hopkins. In fact I wasn't even keeping a close track of the score."

FIRST, SECOND, and third place winners are awarded five, three, and one point respectively, and five points are awarded to the winning relay team. In case of a tie, a special 90-yd. medley relay (back stroke, breast stroke, free style) will determine the winner.
