

# Players to Act on Revolving Stages

Two revolving stages and two movable platforms will be used in the Penn State Players production of "Witness for the Prosecution" at 8 p.m. tomorrow, Friday and Saturday in Schwab.

The sets, designed by William Allison, assistant professor of theater arts, depict a London courtroom and the chambers of the defense attorney for a young man accused of murder.

The play concerns the trial of Leonard Vole who is charged with the murder of a rich, elderly woman whom he had befriended. His lawyer, Sir Wilfrid Roberts, Queen's counselor, tries to save him despite the complications presented by Vole's mysterious, foreign-born wife.

**ROBERTS WILL** be played by Warren Burns, graduate student in theatre arts from Allentown. Joanne Beegle, graduate student in theatre arts from Mahoney City, will portray Vole's wife, Romaine; and John Whitesell, senior in the arts from State College, is cast as the accused, Vole.

Director of the cast of 30 is Walter H. Walters, head of the Department of Theatre Arts. "Witness for the Prosecution" is the first play Walters has directed on campus since 1956.

Tickets for the three perform-

ances are now on sale at the Hetzel Union desk for 75 cents for tomorrow night's show and \$1.25 for the Friday and Saturday evening performances.

# Cold Weather Expected to Continue

The upper air weather regime, which tends to control the surface weather, has changed radically since the weekend. The new pattern favors very cold weather for several days.

Brief, but heavy, snow squalls late yesterday heralded the arrival of a secondary surge of arctic air, and temperatures early today were forecast to be a few degrees above zero.

Today, tonight and tomorrow are expected to be partly cloudy,

windy and very cold with snow flurries.

A high of 16 is forecast for today and a high of 22 is likely tomorrow. A low of five degrees is indicated for tonight.

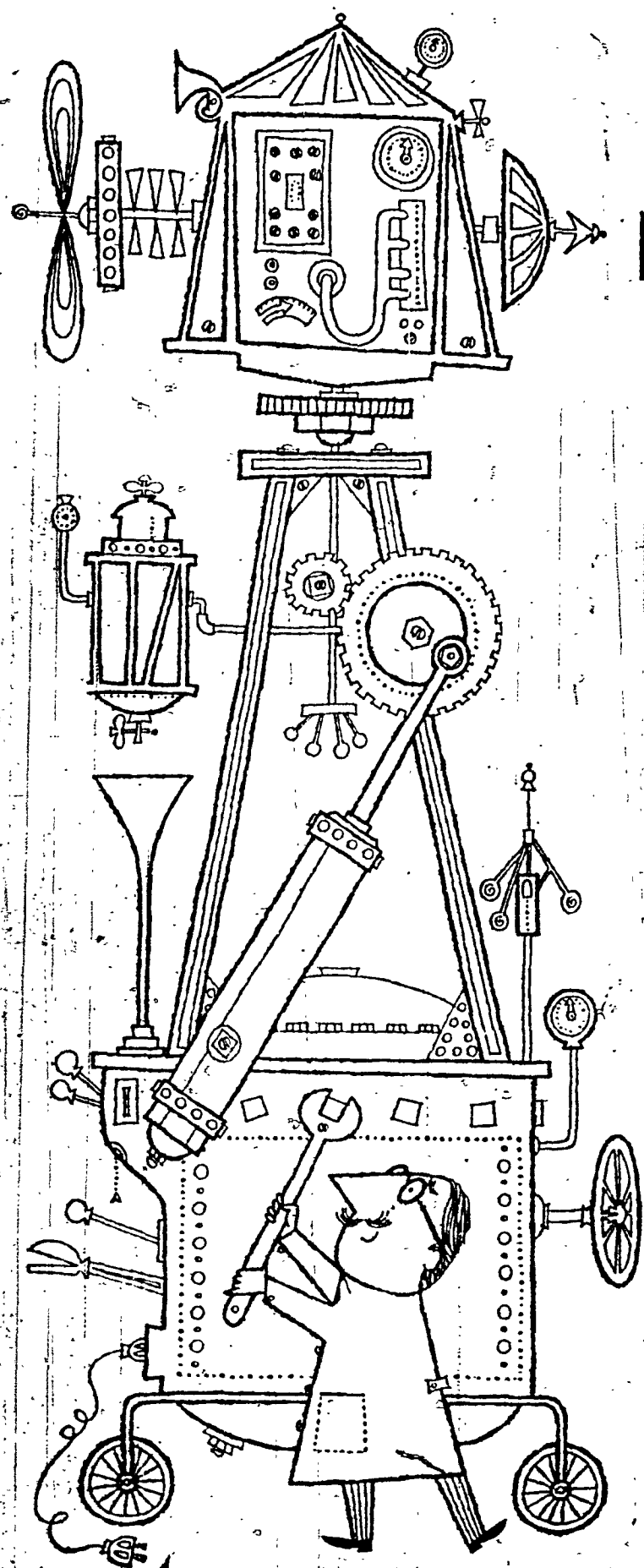
