Also to be considered by the Congress is a proposal by William Lott, representative from Pollock, to form a subcommittee of the Public Relations Agency with the purpose of giving additional support to the University's efforts to obtain more appropriations from the state legislature and to make known the plight of the Penn State student to the citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

THE LOTT proposal calls for a series of articles to be written by students explaining the position of the student body on state appropriations. These articles would be sent to all state newspapers.
