
At a preliminary hearing Al-fred G. Krebs, freshman in counseling from Norristown and Ronald J. Tine, freshman in education from Windsor, Conn, pleaded guilty to charges of having violated the ordinance last Saturday night. Both said they had not been asked for identification when they purchased a pitcher of beer at a local tavern.

Mills said he imposed the minimum fine of \$25 plus \$11.50 costs after the arresting officer testi-fied that both Krebs and Tine had been cooperative at the time of their arrest.


