

Nittany 29, Bucks, Fayette Win IM Swimming Meets

Nittany 29, Bucks, and Fayette scored victories over Erie, Nittany 37, and Jordan in the second round of IM swimming last night at Glennland Pool.

The fastest times of the night were recorded in the Fayette-Jordan contest: when Brian Giersch won the backstroke in 40.6 and Fred Schwartz took first place in the breast stroke in 41.5 to lead Fayette to a 25-12 victory.

IN THE FREESTYLE event, Hugh McGee and Lee Olsen won the only first place for Jordan when they raced to a dead heat in 36.6 seconds. The two swimmers were matched stroke for stroke for the last 10 yards of the race.

John Yocum won first place in the diving, events with a 10.6 to add another five points to Fayette's score.

Nittany 29's victory (28-8) was sparked by John Heid, first in the backstroke (43.4), Jim Pappas, winner of the diving event with a 10.6, and Gerry Coopey, winner of the breast stroke in 48.3. Dick Huber took the only first place for Erie in the freestyle with a time of 39 seconds.

GEORGE PYLE, Drew Meyer, and Ralph Martin took first places in the freestyle, backstroke and diving events, respectively, to account for 15 of Bucks' points in

Johansson to Quit If He Loses Tonight

GOTEBORG, Sweden (AP) — Ingemar Johansson said yesterday he probably will hang up his gloves if he loses tonight's comeback bout to Joe Bygraves. However, Johansson is a 4-1 favorite.

"I want to get back the world title," said the 29-year-old Swede, who won the heavyweight boxing crown from Floyd Patterson in 1959, lost it in 1960 and was knocked out again by Patterson in his last start, March 13, 1961.

"If I do well against Bygraves I will keep pushing toward winning back the crown. If I lose, then I'll probably hang up my gloves for good."

A sellout crowd of 6,000 will watch the fight at Goteborg's Maesshallen Stadium.

Johansson said he is down to fighting weight of 198 pounds. His record is 22-2 with 14 knockouts.

Palmer Leads at Phoenix
PHEONIX, Ariz (AP)—Arnold Palmer came within one stroke of the course record yesterday as he shot a seven-under-par 64 for the first round lead in the \$35,000 Phoenix Golf Open.

Nearest to him, at 67, is Art Wall Jr.

Jack Nicklaus, the chunky 1962 U.S. amateur and intercollegiate champ just turned pro, started off shakily but settled down for a two-under 69. At that level, he was tied with five others.

Uelses Out of Philadelphia Meet

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — With John Uelses, the record breaking pole vaulter sidelined with influenza, the emphasis of the 18th annual Philadelphia Inquirer track and field meet tonight shifts back to the track.

Uelses, the Marine corporal who last Saturday set an unofficial world record of 16'3", is under treatment at the Quantico (Va.) Marine Base Hospital. He'll also miss the Los Angeles Times meet Saturday.

FRANK BUDD, Villanova's 100-yard dash world record holder; Hayes Jones, the almost unbeatable hurdler; Jack Yerman, Olympic quarter miler favored in the 600-yard event, and a couple of classy relay competitions are expected to give the crowd its money's worth.

Henry Wadsworth of the U.S. Army, Orlando Cruz of Villanova, Mel Schwarz, the Marine from Maryland, and John Belitza, also of Maryland, will shoot at the new pole vault record.

STANDOUTS in other events are Cary Weisiger, former Duke ace and now a Marine, and ED MORAN, the former Penn

State miler, in the 1,000; Sandor Iharos, Hungarian sub 4-minute miler, and Tom Sullivan, Villanova freshman, in the mile; Jerry Nourse of Duke in the 2-mile, and high jumper Bob Gardner.

Villanova, New York University and Morgan State are keen rivals in the mile relay, with Fordham the favorite over Villanova and Georgetown in the 2-mile. Ron Delany's Irish team is rated an edge in the special 2-mile relay against a Canadian quartet, and an American team yet to be picked.

PITTSBURGH (AP) — The third time was the charm for slugger Dick Stuart of the Pittsburgh Pirates yesterday as he signed his 1962 contract.

The 29-year-old first baseman came to terms after his third meeting with general manager Joe L. Brown. Stuart probably received a pay boost, a club spokesman said, but salary terms were not announced.

Stuart's 35 home runs last season was a club record for first baseman. He placed fifth among National League sluggers.

A five-year veteran, Stuart hit .301 and also had 117 runs batted in for his best year.
