

# Zeigler to Draw up 4-Term Survey

A questionnaire to determine student reaction to the four-term system will be worded by Martin L. Zeigler, director of student affairs research, and his staff.

The questions for the survey form will be selected by the Inter-College Council Board from suggestions presented by the various councils.

Zeigler and his staff will word the questions so that they will be scientifically objective, Francine Garfinkel, president of the Liberal Arts Student Council said at this week's council meeting.

The final questionnaire form will be approved by ICCB, Miss Garfinkel said, before it is distributed to the student body.

The results of the questionnaire will also be compiled by Zeigler's office, she said.

The questionnaire will be distributed to students at the beginning of the spring term either through the mail or in classes.

The results of the survey will be submitted to the Senate Committee on Calendar and Class Schedule.

In other business, Miss Garfinkel reported that a request to have formal student membership on standing committees of the Liberal Arts faculty was denied.

In a letter to the council it was explained that the standing committees of the college would be urged to invite students to future committee meetings, Miss Garfinkel said.

The letter, received in reply to the council's request was from Warren S. Smith, secretary of the Liberal Arts Planning Committee.

Invitations to attend committee sessions would be extended to students when it is felt that "student representation would be mutually beneficial," she explained. She added that although formal membership was not possible it "is a step in the right direction" to have some means of contact with the faculty.

Students invited to committee meetings would serve in an executive capacity, she said.

THE COUNCIL IS also considering a proposal to sponsor a separate career day about the same time ICCB holds its annual Career Day May 1 and 2.

The reason given in support of a separate career day is that the ICCB project "caters mostly to the other colleges especially the science," Miss Garfinkel said.

radio and television and has sung in opera and light opera productions in southern California cities and the New York area.

Cantor Smith has also composed several songs for Jewish children.
