ISA Changes Name, Constitution

The Independent Student Association voted last night to become the Organization for Campus Social Affairs and passed a by-law to its new constitution which will be submitted to the Senate Committee on Student Affairs.

ISA voted last month to strike the word "independent" from its name and constitution in an effort to make the organization more acceptable to the Senate committee.

The new by-law states that the group will receive all funds through the Associated Student

Activities office on the basis of an allotment which will be determined by the USG budget committee each term.

OCSA will seek to fulfill the non-affiliated student's needs in planning, promoting and executing campus-wide service and social affairs, Barry Rien, president said. All undergraduates will be eligible for membership in OCSA. "OCSA will be essentially the same organization as ISA except that it will not be limited to independent students," Rien said.
