Japanese Olympic Coach Pays Visit to Thinclads

Kumio Yamamoto may not speak much English, but he keeps his eyes and ears open and because of it he's learning plenty about American track and field.

Yamamoto, one of Japan's Olympic coaches, is touring the United States in an effort to learn the fine points behind this country's success in track and field.

He has spent some time with the track coaches at Southern California and San Jose State and has been to New York City to see a track meet at Madison Square Garden.

Yamamoto is spending the week with Lion track coach Chick Werner and will travel with State to Michigan this Saturday for a four-team meet at Ann Arbor.

From there he'll go to Lafayette, Ind., to spend a few days with the Purdue coach before heading for London and various points in Europe.

Track and field has not been a particularly strong Olympic event for the Japanese, and apparently they are trying to do something about it.

But Yamamoto isn't devoting all his energies to learning new techniques. He has spent some time with Penn State's thinclads, and Bob Grantham in particular, teaching them new exercises and helping them perfect their styles.

Irish-Orange Feud Brings Rule Change

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — The National Collegiate Athletic Association has amended the football rule which caused the rhubarb on the last play of the Notre Dame-Syracuse game at South Bend last year.

Under the amended rule, Notre Dame, as it did on the controversial play, would under the same circumstances get an extra play. The NCAA has said that under the 1961 rules, Notre Dame should not have had a chance to kick a winning field goal.

Syracuse led 15-14, when Notre Dame tried a field goal which missed. On the play, however, Syracuse was detected running into or roughing the kicker and was penalized 15-yards. Notre Dame, although time had run out, was given another play and kicked the field goal for a 17-15 victory.

Held Five Records

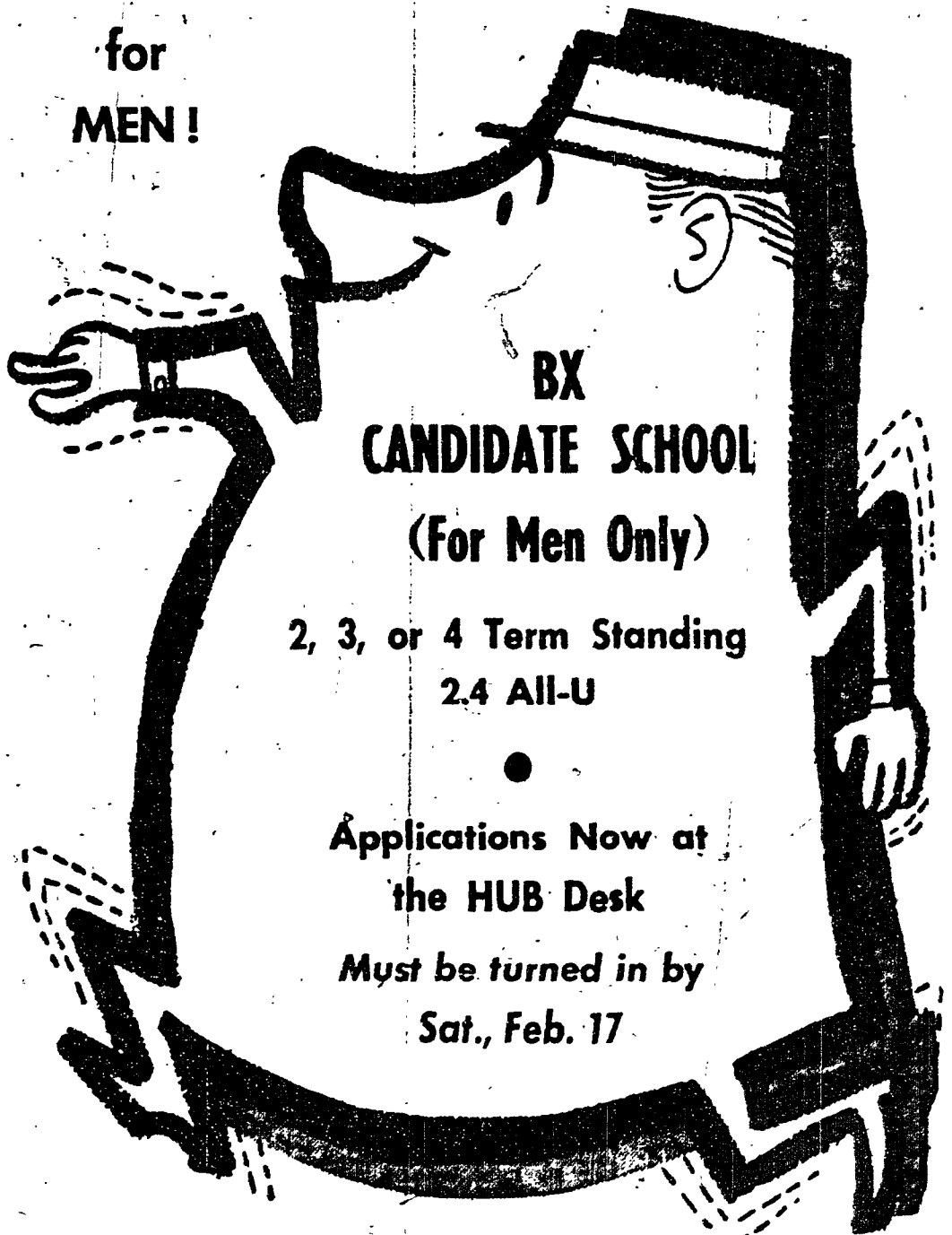
