University Status Explained--

(Continued from page one) Pennsylvania that the state has no state universities.

"Although many people think Penn State is a state university, it is not, because government representation on its board of trustees is less than 20 per cent of the board."

On another occasion, Polen told a group of Penn State students (May 23, 1961) that "the University is not a state university. It is a Land-Grant college. There is a difference."

Poorman quoted President Eric A. Walker's comment: "All this furor about whether or not Penn State is the state university puzzles me. I believe every president in the past has believed it is and has said it is, and I do also."

"THERE ARE literally dozens of pieces of evidence, ranging all the way from the fact that our appropriations bill is an amend-

ment to the original bill of 1863, while other state-aided colleges must have a new bill each year, to the fact that we act as an instrumentality of the state in dealing with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and so on," Walker said.

According to Poorman's report of Hull's statement, Hull traced the history of the University up to 1921 and stated his opinion as follows:

"By a process of accumulation, and by legal pledges, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania established and maintained Penn State—The Farmer's High School, The Agricultural College, or the University, whatever it has been called—as the State University."
