

Michigan, Purdue to Provide Rough Test for Lion Thinclads

Penn State's thinclads will be chasing two of America's top runners—Ergas Leps of Michigan and Purdue's Dave Mills—when the Lions travel to Ann Arbor, Mich., for a triangular meet tomorrow.

The Lithuanian-born Leps led the Michigan team to the Big Ten title last year, and also put a dent in Penn State's chances for victories in the two and four-mile relays at the Penn Relays last April.

Leps is known for his powerful finishing kick which swept him past Steve Moorhead in the four-mile relay and Howie Deardorff in the two-mile relay to spark Wolverine victories in both events in Philadelphia.

MILLS, ON THE other hand, is not a strong finisher in his specialty, the 440, but his great overall speed helped him set the American indoor record of 47.2 for that distance.

In addition to his record 440 time Mills also holds Boilermaker records in the 600 (1:10) and the 300 (30.5).

Lion coach Chick Werner doesn't know too much about

Mills, but he has painful first-hand knowledge of Leps' ability. "Leps is an outstanding distance runner and a Penn State man has never beaten him in varsity competition," Werner said.

PURDUE WILL boast an outstanding dash man in sophomore Nate Adams. Competing unattached as a freshman last year, Adams tied the American indoor record of 7.0 in the 70-yard dash in winning that event at the Mason-Dixon Games in Louisville, Ky.

State is still hampered by a weak field team and lack of practice facilities.

"When a field house team like Michigan meets a balcony team like Penn State it is usually the team that has the better training facilities that wins," Werner said.

with reference to Penn State's "indoor balcony track."

Steve Moorhead and Gerry Norman will have the unpleasant task of trying to beat Leps in the mile, and Howie Deardorff faces the same chore in the 1000. Norman in the two-mile seems the best bet for a State victory off his 9:12.8 performance in breaking the Navy Field House record last week.

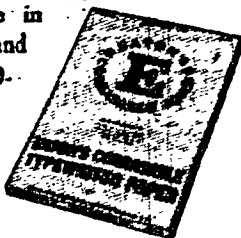
