

159 Apply for '63 Study Abroad Plan

With one week remaining before Friday's deadline, a total of 159 applications have been received for the 1963 Study Abroad program, Dr. Dagobert deLevie, said yesterday.

These applications have been received for both the already-established French and German programs and for a possible Spanish-speaking extension. The total number includes those students who applied for this year's program and were not accepted.

Although 72 students were accepted for this year's program (which does not include the possible Spanish extension), the Study Abroad Committee has not yet determined the number of participants for 1963, deLevie said.

He stressed that no former applicant will be considered unless he submits notification of re-application in 4 Sparks before the deadline. He added that these students will have a better chance this year because of their more advanced term standing.

The break-down of applicants by language is French, 88; Span-

ish, 37; German, 34. This includes the 37 students who have already re-applied.

Applications definitely will not be accepted after Friday, deLevie said. Any student with at least a 2.5 All-University average, the equivalent of 12 credits of a foreign language, and who is "in good standing, shows maturity, stability, self-discipline and academic motivation" will be considered for the program.

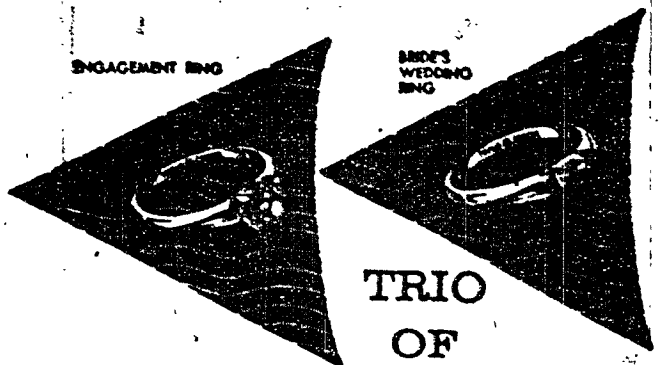
