

# Orange Coach Rates State-Pitt Meet Even

If the Pitt wrestling team thinks it has a push-over this weekend against Penn State, the Panthers had better talk to a man whose team has met both squads.

Syracuse wrestling coach Joe Scandura has watched his Orange grapplers get drubbed by Pitt, 38-2, and tie State, 15-15, but he isn't conceding a thing to the Panthers.

"I'd have to say the match should be pretty even," Scandura said last Saturday in the Rec Hall locker room. "We lost to Pitt early in the season but we're so much improved over then that I feel we could give them a good battle now," he explained.

Scandura was high in his praise for State, but he couldn't help but show his pride for the Orange-men's showing.

"I thought we did a fine job out there, and most of those boys will be back again next year," he said. "We should have a real strong team next year."

While Scandura was happy with the meet, the Lion grapplers certainly weren't.

"I never saw a team that ran so much and did so little wrestling," State co-captain Ron Pifer said after the match. "The only guy who really wrestled was my man." (Pifer won a 3-4 decision on riding time from Dick Slutzky.)

Heavyweight Ed Pohland, who just missed giving the Lions the victory with a pin, was of a similar opinion.

"CERTAINLY MY MAN was running," the blond strongman said. "He could have given Dardoff (Howie) a good race." (Dardoff is one of State's better long distance track runners.)

Phil Myer, whose opponent lay on his stomach most of the bout, didn't say much, but it was obvious he was disgusted.

"He was running," was all that the State co-captain would say. Myer won a 5-1 decision after trying to pin his foe most of the match.

State's peppery little coach Charlie Speidel was short on words also, but long on meaning.

"They wrestled the way they were told to," he said. "It was the only way they had of winning and they did a pretty good job of it."
