

# 'Series' to Present Chamber Choir

The Netherlands Chamber Choir, conducted by Felix de Nobel, will present the next program of the University Artists' Series at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday in Schwab.

Student ticket distribution will begin at 1:30 p.m. tomorrow at the Hetzel Union desk, and will continue all day Sunday through Wednesday. Tickets for the general public at \$1.25 will be available starting Sunday.

THE 18 MEMBERS of the choir include some of Holland's most distinguished singers, all of whom have appeared in recitals, operas, with orchestras and in broadcast concerts.

Felix de Nobel, who founded the choir in 1937, and now conducts it, was at one time a piano accompanist for soloists in Europe. He has recently appeared as a commentator on radio musical programs.

The choir's first performances were radio broadcasts, but soon afterward it was making concert appearances in the leading cities of Europe. The Netherlands considers the choir a cultural ambassador. It has represented the country at the Edinburgh Festival, the festival at Sainte Chapelle and the European Choir Festival in Vienna.

THE CHOIR usually performs a capella in the Dutch tradition, but its repertoire includes music with orchestra, organ or piano.
