

# Commonwealth Campus News

**UNIVERSITY PARK**—A total of 3,201 full-time undergraduates are enrolled at the 13 Commonwealth Campuses and the Mt. Alto forestry school for the winter term, according to Robert G. Bernreuter, registrar. Including special and graduate students, the total is 3,332.

Ogontz Campus, in suburban Philadelphia, has the largest enrollment with 875, while at New Kensington only 92 students are enrolled. Other totals include: Allentown, 105; Altoona, 391; Behrend (Erie), 253; DuBois, 131; Hazleton, 232; McKeesport, 362; Mt. Alto, 106; Pottsville, 210; Scranton, 103; Wilkes-Barre, 159; Wyomissing, 175; and York, 136.

**DUBOIS**—Formal announcement has been made of a plan to launch a fund-raising campaign to finance the building of new classrooms and modern physical education facilities for the DuBois Campus. The goal of the drive, which is sponsored by the DuBois

Educational Foundation representing Clearfield, Elk and Jefferson counties, has been set at \$600,000. It will consist primarily of contributions by business firms and individuals from the area served by the campus.

## Lelyveld to Speak At Chapel Service

Dr. Arthur J. Lelyveld, rabbi of Fairmount Temple in Cleveland, Ohio, will speak on "What's Happening to Man?" at the 10:55 a.m. Chapel service tomorrow in Schwab.

The Chapel Choir, under the direction of James W. Beach, will sing, "Esultate Justi" by Ludovico Viadana. Dr. Leonard Raver, Chapel organist, will play "Prelude in E Flat," "From Deepest Need I Cry unto Thee, O Lord" and "Fugue in E Flat" by Johann Sebastian Bach.

Rabbi Lelyveld is the former National Director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation, the Jewish voluntary religious work agency which serves Jewish students at 225 universities in the United States, Canada, Israel and England.

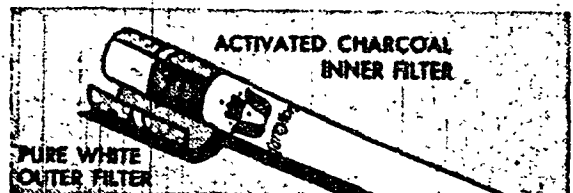
