

3,000 Offered Fall Admission

Offers of admission will be mailed Thursday to 3,000 students who submitted applications for admission to the University Park campus for the fall term, 1962, Robert G. Bernreuter, dean of admissions, said yesterday.

After this date the admissions office will extend acceptances to additional students as it receives refusals from the group of 3,000, Bernreuter said.

The applicants will have two weeks in which to submit replies. The reply must be accompanied

by a \$75 fee, which includes a \$25 charge for application processing and entrance counseling. The additional \$50 will serve as a deposit to hold a place of admission.

ON THURSDAY the admissions office will also extend offers of admission to students wishing to enroll for the summer term here and also to students wishing to enroll at the various Commonwealth campuses.

The 3,000 students receiving the offers of admission are the high-

est ranking applicants, Bernreuter said. All the women receiving acceptances are in the top fifth of their high school graduating classes. The majority of the men to be admitted are also in the top fifth.

The admissions office received about 22,000 requests for applications, Bernreuter said, and had 12,000 completed applications returned. From the 12,000 applications, the admissions office selected the top 3,000 applicants, he said.
