The Circuit Court of Appeals of the District of Columbia will today begin hearing the University's appeal protesting the Federal Communications Commission's denial of an educational TV channel in State College.
 Roy Wilkinson Jr., the University's attorney, said the appeal was filed Aug. 30, 1961, following a ruling by the FCC that if an additional channel is allowed in this area preference will be given to a commercial outlet.

THE SUSPENSION of the publication of The Daily Pennsylvanian occurred Saturday after the Men's Student Government Association voted to recommend the suspension.

A Daily Pennsylvanian parody of Penn's coeds' paper, The Pennsylvania News, triggered the suspension, Longley said.

Many things in the issue led to the suspension. These, he said, were mostly matters of quality and taste. However, feelings against the newspaper's editorial policy had been growing over a period of time, he said.
